Sin is a Disastrous Accident Waiting to Happen!


There are two ways to live our lives. We can live God's way, or we can live our own way.

When we live our lives God's way, life is more fun. Plus, we get protected from choices that can harm us.

When we live our own way we can hurt ourselves and other people. You see, we all have a disease. It doesn't make us vomit or sneeze. It's a spiritual sickness and it makes us selfish and mean and greedy and hurtful. The name of the disease is 'sin'.

God can heal us from this disease if we follow Jesus, but if we live our lives our own way, we'll get sicker and sicker with sin. We will hurt more and more people, and we'll be harming ourselves too. Like driving dangerously in a car, it's an accident waiting to happen!

It is much better to follow Jesus, say sorry for the things we've done wrong and ask Him to heal us from our sin-sickness, so that we can follow Him.



Let's eat, drink and be merry?

No! Look at all of those people partying, enjoying themselves and kicking back.

The salvation soldier is trying to catch their attention, to call them from their distractions to the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ where they can find salvation.

The problem is that the alcohol and other drugs (deadly poisons), the gambling, the gluttony (eating like a pig all the time) are all harmful. For some in the picture, that harm includes addiction, shame and ruin. Broken families and broken promises, lost jobs and lost hope are the result from some of these habits. But for others, their 'pleasure' means that other people, maybe not in the picture, are harmed.


These other people are trafficked, are enslaved, are forced to work in unhealthy conditions to produce the goods and services that those in the picture are enjoying. The salvation soldier is blasting the truth into their ears, trying to make more noise than the blaring sounds of the harmful party, so that they will stop their sinning.

What we have to remember is that none of us deserve to get saved. We have all sinned. Our sin separates all of us from God.



The Mercy Seat

The salvation soldiers in this picture have just had an open air meeting and have come to the most important part of any Salvation Army meeting: the appeal time, also called the prayer meeting. This is the time in the meeting where saints and sinners can encounter God at the mercy seat or the holiness table. Here, the salvation soldiers have used a drum as a makeshift mercy seat. It doesn't matter what it's made of, what matters is that God is there.

We can pray to God at the mercy seat and ask Him to take away our sins and help us to follow Jesus. When we want to give God our whole lives, and ask Him to make us belong to Himself, we can do this at the holiness table. Even if we're just having a bad day and want to pray, we can use these places to meet with God.

When you use the mercy seat or holiness table, usually someone will come and offer to pray with you. They are there to help you and you can talk with them.

God loves you, and loves it when you decide to meet with Him. Have you ever given Him your life and asked Jesus to take away your sins? You don't have to wait until Sunday when you can use the mercy seat, you can ask Him right now today!


Do you think we can reach every nation in this generation? Let's start with you! And your friends!


Family Unity


And you know what? A life spent following Jesus is the best kind of life you can get!

He did. Jesus did not have to suffer and die. He could have stayed in heaven, worshiped by countless angels all the time.


