Jehovah Rocks:

See It:

'Suppose one of you has a hundred sheep and loses one of them. Does he not leave the ninety-nine in the open country and go after the lost sheep until he finds it? And when he finds it, he joyfully puts it on his shoulders and goes home. Then he calls his friends and neighbors together and says, "Rejoice with me; I have found my lost sheep." I tell you that in the same way there will be more rejoicing in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous persons who do not need to repent.' (Luke 15:5-7)

On It:

I am known for losing things. I am not a neat person but losing things is not my fault because I think my things grow legs and wander off! So, I can really relate to these stories. Why does Jesus tell them? Well, Jesus is being picked on by the Pharisees for hanging out with sinners. I guess I should point out again that the Jews were very strict about who you could and couldn't hang out with. It wasn't because they were mean, or because they wanted to keep the popular kids separate from the geeks. It's because it was how they had been taught to be holy. But Jesus came to fulfill that teaching which means He was adding some rules. We are still to be obedient to the law, yet we are to apply grace and love to ALL of God's children... sinners, gentiles, sick etc. So, Jesus tells this story to show us that anyone who is lost from God must be found! We must search high and low, and wide for people who don't know God. We must search our schools, and our community, and our Corps and our sports clubs for people who don't know Jesus!

So, he got up and went to his father. But while he was still a long way off, his father saw him and was filled with compassion for him; he ran to his son, threw his arms around him and kissed him... the father said to his servants, "Quick! Bring the best robe and put it on him. Put a ring on his finger and sandals on his feet. Bring the fattened calf and kill it. Let's have a feast and celebrate. For this son of mine was dead and is alive again; he was lost and is found." So they began to celebrate. (Luke 15: 17-24)

On It:

This is a great parable. It tells us of a young person who asks for his dad's inheritance, and then leaves home for a time of 'wild living'. Well, he ends up poor and homeless and friendless and realizes he wants to go home. But, how can he? He has been a terrible son. How could his father ever forgive him? I mean, he basically told his dad he considered him dead! But the son is desperate, so he heads home and hopes that he will be able to work for his dad as a slave. But when the father sees his son heading home, he races to him, hugs him and forgives him. Then he throws him a party! This is a story of God's love for us. The son comes to the father deserving nothing and yet he gets love and forgiveness. God goes through the pain of watching all His children living a life of 'wild times', but the minute we realize our sin, and head home, He is there to meet us, and throw a party in Heaven!

Don't I have the right to do what I want with my own money? Do you feel cheated because I gave so freely to the others?' So, those who are last will be first. And those who are first will be last.' (Matthew 9-16, read verses 1-16)

On It:

Why did Jesus tell this story? Well the Jews were grumbling saying that it was unfair for the gentiles to suddenly be allowed to get into heaven when God promised it to them first. They had been God's special people for so long and he had made the deal with them, and now the others were getting the same reward. Unfair? I guess so, but it's not fair that God chose them in the first place, either. So, what's in it for us? Well, the next time you think God is being unfair because He decides to bless your neighbour instead of you, just think about all the amazing blessings you have already, and be thankful others have been included, too.

See It:



On It:

There were a whole bunch of people in Jesus' day that assumed, because they were Jewish and because they didn't sin, that they would be resting in Heaven next to all the other famous Bible characters. They also assumed that those who were not Jewish and those that were sinners were going to go to hell. Jesus on the other hand had some different news. He tried to explain that entry into Heaven is not as easy as being born into the right family and keeping a few laws. Instead, entry into Heaven was going to be based on whether people do, or do not know Jesus! So, why is He talking about the door being small and hard to get through? One way to think about it is to imagine a small door. To get through a small door you must first take off your backpack that you lug

around. That's the bit about us taking off the sin that we don't want and giving that over to Jesus to get rid of.


On It:

On It:

The owner was God, the Pharisees were the wicked trustees and He, of course, was the son who lost His life. And what does it mean for us? Well, we must remember, that this world that we live in is not ours. It belongs to God. We are just minding it for Him. So, when God wants something that belongs to Him, we must give it back! We can't claim it just because we have had it for a long time. So be prepared to give up toys, books, clothes, houses, schools and friends. It is important to remember that nothing in this world belongs to you, so instead praise God that you have been blessed with good things rather than getting angry that those good things must now go away.
