

On the left grid, secretly draw these (horizontal or vertical) rectangles representing your fleet of ships:



- 1 x Aircraft carrier 5 adjacent squares
- 1 x Battleship 4 adjacent squares
- 1 x Cruiser 3 " "
- 2 x Destroyers 2
- 2 x Submarines 1 square each

To play, you each take turns making a shot at one of your opponent's ships by calling out the coordinates of a square, such as "D5". Your opponent will say "Hit" if you hit a ship or "Miss" if you miss their ships. When you hit the last square of any ship your opponent must say the name of the ship, e.g. "You sank my Destroyer!"

While playing, each player records their opponents shots on the left grid, and their own shots on the right. An "X" means a hit and an "O" means a miss. The first player to lose all their ships loses the game!
