At the same time, our corps congregations are navigating busy lives, stretched resources and shifting volunteer dynamics. Yet the call to serve, love and transform lives in the name of Jesus remains.

That is why this refreshed vision of CCM expands beyond visitation to include any congregational program that supports a corps in reaching its community through practical, relational ministry. CCM is no longer a ministry of a few—it is an approach that integrates service into the entire life of the corps, creating multiple ways for people to demonstrate the love of Jesus in action.

Why this toolkit?

This CCM toolkit and training resource is designed to equip corps to engage their congregations in meaningful, flexible and impactful ministry. It provides the tools to expand CCM beyond traditional models, allowing corps to connect existing programs and people to service opportunities that reflect their unique community needs.
