METHODOLOGY


This report contains findings from research conducted by Edelman Data & Intelligence on behalf of The Salvation Army to uncover Canadians' attitudes and experiences with poverty and related socioeconomic issues.


The study was conducted from October 12th to 19th, 2023 among a nationally representative sample of 1,515 Canadians who are members of the online Angus Reid Forum, balanced and weighted on age, gender and region. Note: Canadians living in Yukon, Northwest Territories, and Nunavut were not included in the survey.

For comparison purposes only, a probability sample of this size would carry a margin of error of +/-2.5 percentage points, 19 times out of 20. And, where a margin of error is not available, the research department provides a comparable one so that the audience can have some context to the value of the poll.

Please note that research is not necessarily predictive of future outcomes and captures opinions for a point in time. All sample surveys and polls may be subject to other sources of error, including, but not limited to coverage error and measurement error. Statistical margins of error are not applicable to online nonprobability sampling polls.




Canadians' level of pessimism about the future of their personal finances has not subsided since rising in 2022.


Inflation, housing insecurity, and food affordability are top concerns in Canada, followed by other critical issues.

Prices of food and shelter have seen increases since 2020, driving considerable deterioration to the affordability of living in Canada.









About 1 in 10 Canadians are extremely concerned about basic human needs, such as shelter and food, or being affected by a natural disaster or emergency.










Canadians skipped or reduced the size of at least one meal because they couldn't afford to buy groceries (45% among single parents).





Similar to 2022, a significant proportion are making trade-offs to their food choices and eating less due to financial strain.






Among those who accessed a food bank in the last year, almost half (43%) were first-time users, and compared to a year ago, frequency of use has increased.









Similar to 2022, almost 1 in 10 missed or failed to make a rent payment / needed to couch-surf in the last year.







































