- Words to Live By—Relate the Bible and its principles to everyday living using an anecdote or incident from your • own or someone else's life
- Beyond Borders—Christians working and engaging in innovative ways in the developing world
- Someone Cares—First- or third-person account of being helped by The Salvation Army
- The Bottom Line—Christians living out their beliefs by establishing an ethical workplace with ethical practices •
- Love & Life—Explore the Christian dimension to spousal and family relationships
- Between the Lines—Review, preferably with the author's insight, of a fiction or non-fiction book dealing with ٠ faith, religion and/or The Salvation Army
- Hot Topics—A look at a contentious or controversial issue of the day through the lens of faith
- Laughing Matters—A humorous incident viewed through a faith vein
