


The Army Flag

How It All Started ...

The Salvation Army began in 1865 when William Booth, a minister in London, England, decided to take God's love to the streets. With his wife, Catherine, he started sharing the good news about Jesus with the poor, homeless and hungry.

In the beginning, his church was called the East London Christian Mission. In 1878, Booth decided to change the name to The Salvation Army. The Army started working in Canada in 1882. It spread to Bermuda in 1896.

Today, the Army has more than 1.8 million members attending over 14,500 churches in more than 130 countries.






ne day when Paul was in Athens, he was very upset to see that the city was full of idols. So, he went to the synagogue and marketplace to tell Jews and Greeks







But God also gives us an instruction. He tells us to write it down because you can trust His words. They are true.




