

Station 1 - Graffiti Nall Gratitude

Take time as a family to look back and thank God for the ways He's watched over you, provided for you and walked beside you this year.

Mount butchers paper to the wall. Have a selection of markers, crayons and colouring pencils. Families will fill the paper with graffiti - drawing/writing their gratitude prayers.

Station 2 - Grack The Gode

See attached activity code sheet. Using a mobile phone, families will crack the code and reveal a Bible verse.

Station 3 - Make Room

Create a display, using pictures from magazines/catalogues of activities and gadgets that fill up our time/compete for our attention.

Jesus was born in a stable because there was no room in the inn (Luke 2:7). Do we have room for Him in our lives? Look at the display and ask God to show you anything in your life that might be getting in the way of keeping your focus on Jesus, as the first and most important thing in your life. Ask God's forgiveness for times when you have given Him less than first place in your life. Ask for His help and strength to remove, from that first place position in your life, anything that gets in your way of focusing on Jesus.

Write your name on a heart shape and place it on the display, as your way of saying: "There is room in my heart and life for You, Jesus."



Station 4 - Prayers In The Manger

Provide cards and pencils for families to write a prayer to Jesus and place it in the manger.

Station 5 - Light of the World

Supplies: Battery operated candles.

In a world full of darkness, the Light of the World was born. Jesus came to show God's love to a world that was dark with sadness, fear, confusion and sin. His life was like a bright light, showing people the way to God. He came to reveal God's truth to us and to bring us God's forgiveness.

Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows Me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12)

Turn on your candle and pray about a place in your life or in the world where God's light is needed to shine in the darkness.

Station 6: Art Activity

Supplies: Black cardstock or poster board, white glue, salt, watercolour paints or food coloring, paint brushes.

Kids get to create Salt Painted Art. They can come up with their own design, use a scene from the Nativity or spell out "JESUS".



Station 7: God Sightings

Supplies: Christmas tree with string(s) of lights.

Note: As families share, they'll each add a lightbulb to the string of lights on the tree and turn it on. Thank God for the ways He is at work.

Station 8 - Fingerprint Prayers

Supplies: Spinner (attached), Star cutout (attached), paint (assorted colours), wet wipes.

Families will use the spinner to choose what to pray for. When they have finished their prayer, put your finger in the paint and leave a finger print on the star as an 'amen'.

Station 9 - A Sweet Treat

Set-up a sweet treat station, providing supplies for kids to make a Snack Mix. See attached recipe and supplies list.

As you savour the taste, be reminded of how sweet Jesus' love is.



PRAYER SPINNER


Paste this page onto cardboard/cardstock and cut out both pieces.
