CONVERSATION & CONNECTION TOOLS FOR PARENTS

Pause for a moment. Think about the time, work, and energy you put into planning a Sunday school lesson, a youth group event, a Bible study, or an after-school club program. What do you hear when parents pick up their child at the end of your time together? Are you hearing questions like: Did you have fun? Was today's club fun? Did the other kids talk to you? Did anyone notice your new outfit? Or as a leader have you ever tried to ask your kids how they liked the class today? Did you receive either a yes, no, or shoulder shrug response? Are you left wondering if today's topic may already be forgotten?

If we want our students to remember and consider how to put what they've learned during class time into practice, then we need to help parents engage with them the moment they leave our room. One way we can help is provide parents with great questions that require more than a yes, no, or "I don't know" answers. We want to encourage them to engage in conversations with their kids that will help them make stronger connections.
