# **LOGISTICS**

We wanted to offer some clarification on a few logistical items, since there have been a number of questions recently surrounding them in the last few days.

### Rooming

Quad and Triple rooming options may require two youth to share the same queen or king size bed. We apologize for any confusion around this that the previous information on the website may have caused. This information has since been updated.

### Chaperones

For clarity we want to state that we will be adhering to the Territorial Abuse Prevention policy in regards to chaperones. This means that no chaperone will be permitted to share a bed with a youth delegate (though they may share a room); all chaperones must have completed the outlined abuse prevention training and have submitted all necessary documents (i.e. background check, signed statement for work with children and youth, etc.) as per the policy; and, there must be at least one chaperone of the same gender for youth delegates attending from each corps.

In addition the maximum ratio of chaperones to youth delegates will be 1:8, so for example, if you have 8 girls and 4 boys attending you need one male and one female chaperone, or if you have 10 girls attending you need two female chaperones. We are encouraging corps to work together, if needed, to ensure proper chaperoning is in place. Feel free to network with other corps in your division to see if sharing chaperone responsibilities might be mutually beneficial.

#### Travel

We recommend the use of this form but it does not need to be returned to THQ; it can be kept on local file at the corps.

#### Safety

To ensure the wellbeing of all the delegates, especially those who may not be used to traveling without parent/guardians, we are encouraging corps to put in place some guidelines for their delegates surrounding check in with chaperones, walking the city, leaving sessions, etc. In addition THQ will have volunteers in place each evening to escort the delegates, as a group, from the venue back to the hotel, and will have a check in process each evening to ensure everyone has returned to the hotel for the night.
