Pre-Mission Activity



Supplies Needed

• Recruits' copy of the "God's Soldier" page that they took for homework

Directions

DO: Provide recruits with time to share their research from last week- they may do this all together or in small groups. You may wish to put their work on display somewhere around the church.





Mission Uplink 1



Have ready YouTube playlist: "Season 3 – We Are An Army Episode 3: What We Believe"

Play "We Are An Army (S3) Episode 3 (1/4)". Episode begins with the *Ready to Serve* theme song, followed automatically by the MISSION # 1 VIDEO. Pause the video when the MISSION # 1 CARD appears on screen and remains as you and your recruits complete Mission # 1.

If using PPT for video, have WAAA-Episode_3-What_We_Believe.pptx ready and play slide one. Pause on the MISSION # 1 CARD so you and your recruits can complete Mission # 1.



Mission #1



Supplies Needed

- Doctrine Category page (see attachment page 7)
- Copy of "We Believe..." cut apart with enough strips for each recruit to have one. If necessary more than one recruit may have the same doctrine (see attachment page 8)
- Three Hula Hoops
- Optional: A video recording device, if you wish to turn this information into a video to share with the corps.



Mission Assignment

SAY: Let's countdown from three to read our first mission card together, 3 – 2 – 1 (read mission card from satellite uplink). "In order to live what you believe, you need to KNOW what you believe. Dig into what the big beliefs of The Salvation Army are, and prepare a creative way to share them with your corps."

SAY: Poor Simon, he's trapped out in the cold! Kate had promised to let him back in, but I have a feeling she wasn't really paying attention to what she was promising. Have you ever promised to do something without realizing just what you'd gotten yourself into? (Be ready to share a personal example, if recruits don't have any to share. For example, a time when you offered to help a friend do something, but later realized it was something you hated to do/was scary/took a lot of time/you just forgot about it, etc.)

SAY: This is exactly what John Eric, the new recruit, is afraid of. He doesn't want to make a promise without knowing what he's getting into.

SAY: In The Salvation Army, we have a group of doctrines that determine what we say and do. A doctrine is just a fancy way of saying what we believe and teach others. Our doctrines or beliefs help make it clear what it is we in The Salvation Army believe.

DO: Spread three hula hoops (or another marker that will signify a zone) out on the floor. Place a Doctrine Category above each of the hula hoops (Who God Is, How God Speaks, How We Should Live).

SAY: I am going to hand each of you one of our doctrines. I want you to read it aloud and decide which hula hoop it belongs in. Since the doctrines can be a lot to remember, this will help us to get a clearer picture of what they mean.

DO: Give recruits one of the doctrines and take turns reading them out loud and placing each one where they think it would belong.

SAY: Now that we have grouped the doctrines, can we think of a few sentences that would summarize them so that we could share with the Recon Team?

DO: Brainstorm a quick summary. It may look something like:



Who God Is:

We believe in one God, who is part of the Trinity.

God the Father, God the Son and God the Holy Spirit are equal.

Jesus was fully God and fully man.

How He Speaks:

God speaks through his word and the Holy Spirit.

How We Should Live:

We believe that people became sinful and fall short of the Glory of God.

BUT - that we are saved through Jesus dying on the cross.

The only way we can be saved is by asking for forgiveness.

After that, we have to continue to try and do what is right/seek forgiveness when we do wrong.

Doing this will give us the gift of eternal life.

But those who do not will spend eternity in hell.

Optional: If you choose to: work together to plan a creative way to share what you have learned about our doctrines with your church. For example, have the recruits recite the doctrines and then have them each take one part of the summary you wrote together and read it while you record it in a video. This could then be played for the congregation on a Sunday morning. You may ask them to hold up the words of the doctrine that goes with the part they are summarizing (like a sign while they speak).

Another option is to have recruits present it live to your congregation. If doing this, take some time to practise it now.

SAY: Excellent work at wrapping your heads around our doctrines, recruits. Let's share what we have learned with the Recon Team.



Mission Uplink 2

Mission #2



Supplies Needed

- Two copies of doctrines from We Believe... (used in Mission Assignment # 1)
- Two copies of Doctrine Bible Verses (see attachment page 9)
- Doctrine Bible Verses Teacher Copy (see attachment pages 10 and 11)



Mission Assignment

SAY: Well recruits we have our second mission for today. Let's give a loud drumroll and then read it together. (Read mission card from satellite uplink) "Now that we know what we believe, we need to know why we believe it! Dig into God's Word and discover where our doctrines come from."

SAY: Kate was right when saying that knowing just what The Salvation Army believes is important when deciding to make a promise, like the promise some of you made when you became a junior soldier (or you WILL make when you choose to become a junior soldier).

SAY: Naomi mentioned that we need to figure out just where The Salvation Army got the ideas for their doctrines from. Where do YOU think the ideas came from? (*The Bible*) Exactly! We didn't just write our doctrines based on what we guessed might be true or wanted to be true. We went to God's word to see what it had to say.

SAY: To complete your next mission you are going to race to match our doctrines to what the scripture says. I will be placing you on two teams to sort the doctrines with their matching scripture. Here is the trick, though! Some of the Bible verses you have will not match any of the 11 doctrines. The first team to match each doctrine with its scripture first will be the winner!

DO: Pass each team a set of Bible verse strips and set of doctrines. They will begin when you say "Go!" Be sure to take up the answers after the game.

SAY: Way to rise to the challenge, recruits! (Or should I say rise to the mission?) It's a little clearer now that The Salvation Army doctrines are based on scripture truths. However, some of them are less clear than others. For example, we believe in the Trinity, but there is no single verse of scripture that clearly states the Trinity exists. That was discovered after much research and study of many different scriptures within the Bible.

NOTE

Squad leader, if you have a small squad work together to see if you can match up the doctrines with the Bible yerses.

SAY: The Salvation Army thought long and hard, diving into the scriptures, to decide what they believe to be true. It's nice to know that lots of thought and consideration was put into deciding what the Army believes. We can be more confident in our choices, when we have scripture to back it up!

SAY: Let's send these Bible verses to control central.





Mission Uplink 3



YouTube: Play "We Are An Army (S3) Episode 3 (3/4)". Pause the video when the FIELD MISSION CARD appears on screen and remains as you and your recruits complete the Field Mission Project.

PPT: Click to advance to next slide. Pause video when FIELD MISSION CARD appears on screen and remains as you and your recruits complete the Field Mission Project.



Field Mission Project



Supplies Needed

• A copy of the Junior Soldier Promise (see attachment page 12)

Mission Project

SAY: Recruits, are you ready for your final mission of the day? Let's read it together (read mission card from satellite uplink). "Now that you know what we believe, it's your turn to decide if you want live by these beliefs."

SAY: Alex just mentioned the Chapter Psalm 103. Later on in the chapter, the verses say "but the love of the LORD remains forever with those who fear him. His salvation extends to the children's children of those who are faithful to his covenant, of those who obey his commandments." (Psalm 103:17-18)

SAY: How does this relate to our doctrines and promises we make in The Salvation Army? (Our doctrines remind us what we believe God's word tells us, and the promises are how we will live in order to show those beliefs and obedience to God.)

SAY: In The Salvation Army, we have a promise that is based on our doctrines. It is called the Junior Soldier Promise. While the doctrines tell about WHAT we believe, this promise gives us a map on HOW we can live out our beliefs every day.



Prayer Huddle



YouTube: Play "We Are An Army (S3) Episode 3 (4/4)". Pause the video when the PRAYER HUDDLE CARD appears on screen and remains as you and your recruits complete the prayer huddle.

PPT: Click to advance to next slide. Pause video when PRAYER HUDDLE CARD appears on screen and remains as you and your recruits complete the prayer huddle.





Supplies Needed

- A copy of The Junior Soldier Promise for each recruit (see attachment page 12)
- Pens

Directions

DO: Pass out copies of The Junior Soldier Promise and pens.

SAY: Today for our prayer huddle, we are going to reflect on this promise. Some of you may already be Junior Soldiers and have made this promise before, and that's great! Even if you've already made this promise, it is important to check-in and think about how well you are keeping this promise in your life. If you are not a Junior Soldier yet, this may be the first time you are seeing a promise like this. Whether it's a new promise or an old one, it is important to decide how YOU want to live your beliefs for God.

SAY: I will read through the promise first, while you think and reflect on what it says. Then, we will read it together as you decide whether you wish to make a promise like this one to God or if you would like to renew your Junior Soldier promise today. At the end, I will ask you to sign your name at the bottom if you decide to that you would like to know more about this promise and become and junior soldier – someone who promises to live in a way that is obedient to God. If you wish to renew your promise today, I'll ask you to sign your card as well. If you're not sure you are ready to make this promise, that's okay. Feel free to take this promise home, think about it and talk about it with your family.

DO: Read through the promise (slowly). Take time to explain or clarify what it means. Then read through it again with the recruits. Have them sign on the line that is appropriate for them.

SAY: Awesome God, I want to pray over all the recruits today, who made the choice to promise to do their best to live for you and what you tell us in the Bible. I pray you will give them the strength to do their best to keep this promise. Those times when they may not keep that promise, I pray that you would remind them that no one is perfect. We are human and all make mistakes. What is most important is that they try their best, and realize when they need to ask for forgiveness and help to get back on track. I'm so proud

of these recruits, as I know you are too. Help their lives to be an amazing example of what they believe. Amen.

SAY: Recruits, you made a HUGE decision today, and I couldn't be more excited for you. If you are someone who chose not to sign this promise yet, I encourage you to really think about it. Talk with your family and when you feel ready, come see me and I'll tell you more about becoming a Junior Soldier or junior member of The Salvation Army.
