



"The virgin will conceive and give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel" (which means "God with us"). Matthew 1:23

The name Immanuel emphasizes the nearness of God. Jennifer Kennedy Dean writes that, "This doesn't just mean God somewhere in the vicinity. Or God down the street. Or God within shouting distance. God is with us." (Pursuing The Christ)

In Matthew 14, the gospel writer gives us a wonderful picture of His nearness in action. Matthew tells how Jesus sent His disciples across the Sea of Galilee after a busy day of ministry while He stayed behind to pray. As daylight faded, a storm came up, churning the sea into a choppy nightmare.

Mark adds the detail that when the boat was in the middle of the Lake, Jesus "saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them" (Mark 6:48).

The word Mark used for "straining" speaks of hard toil. There was great pain and torment of the body and soul that night as those men rowed for their lives against the wind. The wind was aggressive to their purpose, fighting them for every inch.

And from the mountainside, Jesus saw them! Then He went to them. He walked right into the fury of the storm.

Does this move you as it moves me? This is no sleepy, unconcerned God who idly observes the suffering of His children. This is God-With-Us. Immanuel comes down the mountain and steps into the dark, foaming sea. He moves near.

He saw the disciples straining at the oars, because the wind was against them. Shortly before dawn he went out to them, walking on the lake. He was about to pass by them, but when they saw him walking on the lake, they thought he was a ghost. They cried out, because they all saw him and were terrified. Immediately he spoke to them and said, "Take courage! It is I. Don't be afraid."Then he climbed into the boat with them, and the wind died down. (Mark 6:48-51)

The wind had been against them. Contrary to them. Aggressive to their efforts and goals and desires. Isn't that a picture of life? Maybe circumstances have been "contrary" to you in recent days. Maybe you feel as though you've been walking against the wind or rowing until your heart breaks but making no progress at all. What can keep you, and what keeps me, is the knowledge that God watches it all. Jesus sees everything. He sees our struggles. He knows when the wind is against us. But He doesn't just watch. He comes to us—at the right time. He steps into our circumstances to help us.

At this Christmas season, you and I can be assured that Immanuel is with us. We are not without God's love or His all-sufficient strength. We are not without His safety. We are not without His care or provision. And we are not without His presence. This is the best news of all. Immanuel, God is with us!

Christmas time can be super busy, especially in The Salvation Army and we want you to take a moment to stop and savor the season. To help with that we are issuing a Christmas challenge!




