INTRODUCTION

The Sermon on the Mount is a collection of Jesus' kingdom messages. The Beatitudes, which form the core of this teaching, are among the most important teachings of the New Testament. Through the Beatitudes Jesus introduces the paradox of kingdom living, exposing a new way of thinking about and responding to life's varied experiences. Young people need to experience this difference. They need to see in us that living as a Christian is a different lifestyle from the way people in the world live. This is a difficult concept for us to live out, but we must.

Jesus challenges us to see the essentials of life and living. In the Beatitudes, Jesus reveals that attitude and character are more important than material things and circumstances. In these few words Jesus sums up the essence of living a life within God's will. He speaks to our self-awareness in verses 3 - 6. We are blessed with the kingdom if we are "poor in spirit", that is if we think of ourselves soberly. Paul reminds you and your young people "do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you" (Romans 12:3). We are blessed when we mourn. In times of sorrow and sadness we will be comforted by God if we turn to him.

Meekness is a concept which may seem foreign to your students. Many equate meekness with weakness, but it is anything but. Meekness is power and/or strength under control. Like a horse which is broken to the bit retains his strength under the control of his rider, so when we submit to God's control, our weakness is strengthened. Where we are weak, God is strong. He will strengthen us to do the task to which he has called us.

If we are to live a Christ-like life, one that is visibly different from the world, the way we react to life's experiences must be different. When we seek to know God, not just to know about him, our daily interactions will change. God promises that our hunger and thirst after righteousness, will be met. Our

heart will be purified and we will be able to extend mercy to and make peace with those around us because we have experienced them in our own lives. As we live in an ever closer relationship to God, we are able to live a Christ-like lifestyle which will speak to others.



Sometimes being different means being laughed at, sometimes it means you are unique or special. Your preteens and teens may like the idea of being different or they may hate it depending on how confident they feel about themselves.

Today is an opportunity to get the message out there, that in God's scheme of things, different is happy!

UNFINISHED SENTENCES

Supplies: copies of **RESOURCE 1A** cut, pens/pencils, small treat.

Distribute copies of **RESOURCE 1A** and ask your students to fill in the unfinished sentences as fast as possible, first person done gets a treat.

Now ask them to fold their papers and place them into whatever you can find around (box, hat, bag).

Now mix up the papers and redistribute. One by one have the students share the written answer of their classmates, but discourage any negative responses to others' answers.

SACRIFICE

Supplies: enough Hershey's kisses for each student, one larger chocolate bar/treat.

Distribute a Hershey's kiss to your students, making sure you run out before you get to the last student.

(To student without kiss) If I had a Hershey's kiss, I would give you mine, but I didn't get one either. Is there anyone else who would like to give their Hershey's

kiss?

Allow a few seconds to lapse, and encourage if you have to until someone gives up their candy.

The Bible tells us that sometimes we have to give up something that we enjoy, love or value, and that God will reward us with something better.

Give the person who sacrificed their Hershey's kiss the larger chocolate bar/treat.

Sometimes we might see the benefits of our sacrifice, and sometimes it may not be obvious for many years, or perhaps not until after we die.

The Beatitudes, which are the theme for this new Bible Study, are going to show us some valuable things we can gain by being very different from our world.

MOCK AUCTION

Supplies: game money, several items as listed on **RESOURCE 1B**, gavel/hammer, cards with a different number for each student.

As your students enter, give each one an auction number and 10,000 dollars. Explain that you are holding an auction, that you will give a detailed description of each item and then open the floor for bids. Have some fun and do your best job as an auctioneer (or bring in a guest).

MATERIALS:	RESOURCE 1C, 1D
Student Handout	Piece of rough wood
Bibles	Magic Mud (see recipe page 4)
Pen/pencils	RESOURCE 1E (optional)



Bring to class a piece of rough wood. Ask the class to take turns feeling the wood and instruct them to (lightly) rub their finger against the grain of the wood (not too hard so that you don't have any slivers to deal with).

What happens when you rub this wood in the wrong direction? (you could get a sliver/splinter)

What happens when you do something that everyone thinks is really different or strange? (people look at you funny, stare, ridicule or tease you)

Sometimes we refer to different actions as "going against the grain". How is being different from others represented by this expression? (because when you do things differently sometimes you can get hurt, others may hurt your feelings because they don't like it)

Ask your students to share an occasion when they decided to be drastically different from their friends (ie. they dyed their hair, wore a crazy hat to school, etc.) Ask questions to find out how they felt, how everyone reacted, did those reactions have an effect on whether or not they would do something similar again.

READ TOGETHER THE INTRODUCTION ON THE STUDENT HANDOUT

Most of us tend to think that we will be happier if everyone around us thinks we are normal and great. We often judge our actions based on what we think is acceptable to our friends. But Jesus taught that to follow God we will need to think about things the way God thinks, not the way our friends think. Some of these teachings are found grouped together in Matthew's gospel, in a collection of sermons that Jesus preached. A particular set of verses have become known as the Beatitudes, because they are presented like sayings. There are nine of these sayings, which we are going to study.

Sometimes there are hidden values in things which might look valueless.

READ TOGETHER 'THE ANT AND THE CHRYSALIS' (RESOURCE 1C)

When you find a statement that seems to tell you something contrary to common sense, we refer to it as a PARADOX (see definition in STUDENT HANDOUT). We use these expressions in our day to day life. One common paradox is "NO PAIN, NO GAIN". (Ask your students to explain this expression in their own words and give an example of how it might be true.)

Look up the Biblical paradoxes (inside **STUDENT HANDOUT**) and discuss why they are paradoxical.

Refer your students to the inside of the **STUDENT HANDOUT** and ask them to write their own creative definition of happiness on the lines provided. Then instruct them to answer the questions: "List three things that you think would make you very happy" and "List a reason why this might make you happy, for each".

READ TOGETHER THE PARAPHRASED BEATITUDES (RESOURCE 1D)

Jesus taught in his sermons, a radically different way of living than what people expected. During this course of study on the Beatitudes we are going to take a closer look at these teachings to discover what Jesus meant by these things, and how we can follow his example.

Jesus promises his followers the experience of happiness. Not the short-lived happiness of getting something you want, but a happiness that will last forever, because it comes from knowing that we are loved and accepted by God. Not the happiness that comes from circumstances that you like, or from having things go your way, but a happiness that is beyond understanding because it endures even when things are awful and everything seems to be going wrong.

From now on when we think of the Beatitudes, think about the great joy that comes from knowing that you belong to God for eternity. Nothing in this world can take that away.



NEED:

One-two batches of 'magic mud' (recipe below). This substance is interesting in that it appears to be quite a solid paste, but when you pick it up and squeeze it, it turns to a liquid and runs through your fingers.

Try it!

MAGIC MUD
5 tbsp cornstarch
3 tbsp water
Mix together until it
is pasty.



Place a bowl of magic mud on a table and spread newspaper over the table surface.

Think about the things you wrote down that you think will make you happy. Are they the things that the world says will make you happy? Or do they seem like things that God would say bring happiness?

While you think about one of those things, take a handful of the mud and squeeze it as you would if you wanted to hold on to something wonderful. What happens? (it slips through your fingers, it dissolves). This is like the happiness that the world offers. It is temporary and it fades away quickly.

While the students still have 'magic mud' in their hands, ask your students to close their eyes and listen as you read the following verses, then conclude in prayer.

Jesus said: "I give you peace, the kind of peace that only I can give. It isn't like the peace that this world can give. So don't be worried or afraid." (John 14:27) "I've loved you the way my Father has loved me. Make yourselves at home in my love. If you keep my commands, you'll remain intimately at home in my love. That's what I've done--kept my Father's commands and made myself at home in his love. I've told you these things for a purpose: that my joy might be your joy, and your joy wholly mature. This is my command: Love one another the way I loved you." (John 15:9-11)

FOLLOW-UP SUGGESTION: Ask your students to analyze 3 of their favourite songs over the following week, using RESOURCE 1E.
