“What you do for kids will transform the culture of your church.

Something transformational happens in churches when more children and teenagers are around.

Parents become more engaged. Volunteers become more motivated. Staffs become more focused. Everybody becomes more involved. You church will love deeper, think harder, laugh louder, and pray more. What you do for kids will keep your church from dying.

The age of the average church member increases by seven years every decade and in the next ten years, the average age of members in many mainline denominations will be over sixty. In most places, the average age of a churchgoer is fifteen years older than the surrounding community members.
