4. What does _____ (Dignity, Hope, Service, Stewardship) look like in our context? How does it influence how we operate?
5. What actions can we take in our day-to-day context that will bring our Core Values to life?
6. What other values do you see in our context that relate to our four Core Values? Or interfere with our Core Values?
7. What do you appreciate most about our Core Values?
8. Are there ways in which our Core Values hinder our ministry efforts?
9. How can leaders in your context help you bring the Core Values to life? How do our Core Values relate to our Territorial Mission and Vision?
