### Pray

Host an evening prayer and meditation event. Gather with other communities of faith. Set up prayer stations. Take time during your Sunday worship service to pray for those affected by human trafficking. Distribute the 2015 Annual Day of Prayer Guide.

### Consume less

When we consume products and services we often feed into unjust chains of supply. Identify the role you play in human slavery. Take the quiz at: <http://slaveryfootprint.org>. Brainstorm ways to be a better consumer.

### Spread the news

Host a fair trade market. Invite local artisans to offer their goods.

Arrange an information and action display at a park or community centre. Include a blank prayer poster and markers so people can write out their prayers.

Organize a letter writing campaign to inform elected officials (see [www.bit.ly/ObXjbZ](http://www.bit.ly/ObXjbZ)).

Facilitate a Q&A event with Salvation Army employees and volunteers engaged in anti-human trafficking efforts through social services.

Use social media to spread the news about human trafficking.
