

Together in Mission Discussion Questions

WEEK 1

- 1. What stood out/challenged you from the first chapter or in what Comm. Needham spoke about today?
- 2. What will it look like to live out your holiness in the world?
- 3. After reading this chapter, and listening to Comm. Needham reflect on it, in what ways is God leading you toward obedience and surrender?

WEEK 2

- 1. What resonated for you in what the panellists spoke about or in the 2nd chapter?
- 2. What does the practice of holiness look like in your own life?
- 3. How does holiness impact your life in community?

WEEK 3

- 1. What challenged your thinking about discipleship from either chapter 3 of the book or from listening to Danielle share?
- 2. As you reflect on your corps/ministry unit/community, what aspects of discipleship are currently in place? What avenues of discipleship do you need to be intentional about moving forward?
- 3. As you reflect on what you have heard today, what are the areas of discipleship/ mentorship that need to be addressed in your own life?

WEEK 4

- 1. Jesus calls us to change ourselves. In these past few weeks or months, how has God been calling you to change? Are there steps you need to take toward that growth?
- 2. Jesus calls us to change our corps. In these past few weeks or months, our world has rapidly changed. How do you see God at work in the midst of that in your corps setting? Is there a need for improvement? If so, what could be done?
- 3. Jesus calls us to change the world. What needs to happen so that you, along with other members of the corps you attend, can live out a world-impacting and mobile holiness?

WEEK 5

- 1. From what you have read or what Colonel Hill has shared today, what has impacted you or challenged your way of thinking?
- 2. As you reflect on what you have read and heard, what part of The Salvation Army's story would you like to see realized in your corps in a fresh and engaging way to serve mission?
- 3. What could your corps/church do to encourage its members to be faithful to the Bible's story and live out the Army's story in its life and mission?

WEEK 6

- 1. From what you have heard tonight or read in chapter 6 of Christ at the Door, what stood out to you, or challenged your way of thinking?
- 2. What steps do you feel you or our corps/church needs to take to improve the spiritual depth and missional breadth of your life personally and /or corps?
- 3. What thoughts might you have about how your corps could better treat discipleship, worship, Bible study, and mission as an indivisible whole?

WEEK 7

- 1. From what you have heard tonight or read in chapter 7 of Christ at the Door, what stood out to you, or challenged your way of thinking?
- 2. Are there principals or tools you have learned from tonight's discussion or your reading you feel could help your church become more of a movement (like the early church in the New Testament)?
- 3. Describe a step you think your corps/church could take to better centre itself in Christ's mission.
- 4. Is there any aspect of your own corps/church involvement that you would like to be more fruitful and missional? What can you do personally to move in that direction?

WEEK 8

- 1. What has challenged you or stood out to you as you read through chapter 8 and listened to the guests tonight?
- 2. What step(s) in worship could your corps/church take in order to challenge and help all members at worship to grow in holiness?
- 3. What can you do personally to relate your own worship to your life calling and your mission/service in the world?

WEEK 9

- 1. How could your corps/church better prepare its soldiers/members to be disciples that disciple?
- 2. In what specific ways could you see yourself helping someone else in your corps/ church develop as a disciple of Jesus?
- 3. What has challenged you or stood out to you as you read through chapter 9, and listened to the guests tonight?

WEEK 10

- 1. Reflecting on chapter 10 and tonight's discussion, what has stood out to you, or challenged you?
- 2. Reflecting on your corps/church, how is it responding to marginalized communities? How could that response imitate or reflect Jesus more?
- 3. How could you more fully bring Jesus into your personal and private relationships?

WEEK 11

- 1. How can your corps/church become a better and more effective covenant community, united together in Christ in its purpose, life and mission? Be specific.
- 2. How seriously do you take your calling to be a blessing to others? How could you improve your response to this calling?
- 3. Based on what you have heard tonight or read, how can your corps be more effective in supporting the mission of its soldiers/members in their everyday life?
- 4. What challenged or encouraged you tonight or in the reading of chapter 11?

- 1. What has challenged you or stood out to you as you read through chapter 12 and listened to our Territorial Leaders tonight?
