It is estimated that 50% of **Canada's Sex Trafficking Victims** in Canada are Indigenous


12-14 years of age is the average age of entry into the sex trade in Canada



\$280,000 is the estimated average annual profit from a victim of sex trafficking in Canada. Traffickers and exploiters keep all the money



\$300-\$1500 is the estimated range of daily earnings off of one victim. Traffickers and exploiters keep the money



Modern Slavery and Human Trafficking - Statistics for Canada and Bermuda



In 2018, a new record was set with 32 770 Mexicans entering Canada on work permits.



It is estimated that around 80 000 Temporary Foreign Workers come to Canada every year mainly from Mexico and the Caribbean.

Lack of permanent status, work permits and housing tied to their employer, physical and social isolation, limited access to support and settlement services, and the lack of monitoring this program make these individuals very vulnerable to exploitation

Trafficking in human beings is the most extreme form of exploitation faced by migrant workers in Canada

As of May 2019, there has only been 227 human trafficking specified and / or related convictions under the Criminal Code and only 1 conviction under the Immigration and Refugee Protection Act

It is difficult to find any statistics on modern slavery and human trafficking for Bermuda. Yet, that does not mean it is not happening.



It was estimated that on any given day in 2016, there were 17 000 people living in conditions of modern slavery in Canada

Between 2009 and 2016, there was a total of 865 victims of human trafficking. 95% of those victims were women

As of November 2017, there have been 455 cases of human trafficking identified since 2005. Of these 455 cases, 433 cases were domestic trafficking cases where Canadians or foreign citizens were exploited within Canada. There are thousands of human trafficking cases unidentified throughout Canada.
