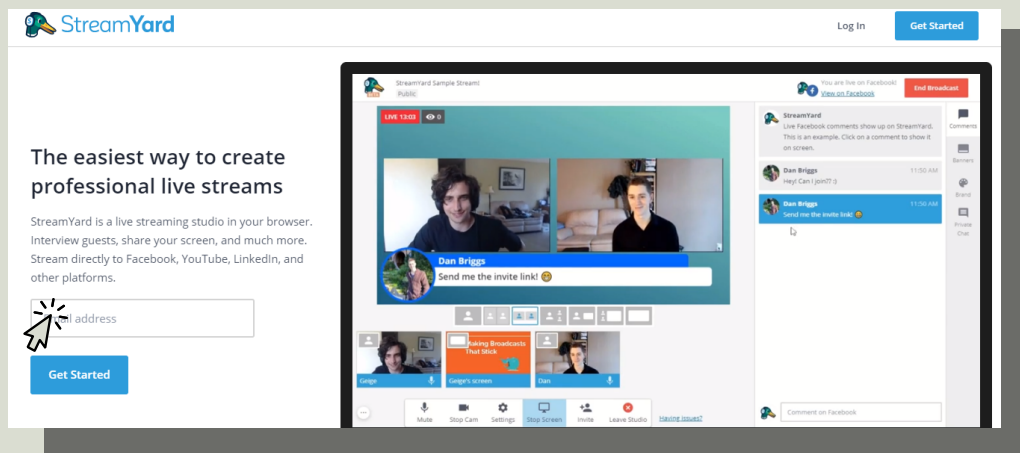


## SIGN UP

### STEP 1

Go to [www.streamyard.com](http://www.streamyard.com) to create an account.



### STEP 2

A 6 digit authentication code will be sent to the email address you register with to both register and login.

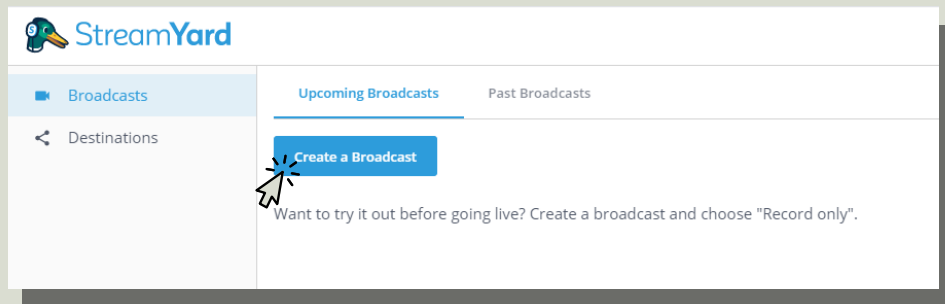

**NOTE:** This is not like a normal signup in the sense that you don't create a password. Instead, a new 6 digit code is sent for every new login.

# SETTING UP BROADCAST

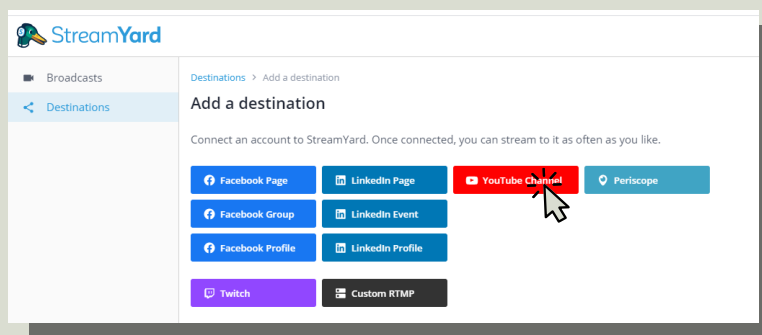
## STEP 3

On your account dashboard you will see two tabs. Clicking “Create a Broadcast” and selecting to “skip, record only” gives you the chance to roam freely in the broadcast studio without being live.



## STEP 4

Selecting your stream destination is easy. Let's say we are streaming to YouTube, connecting this channel is as simple as the click of a few buttons, but to ensure easy access, make sure your user names and passwords are handy.




**NOTE:** Computers connecting to StreamYard must use the Google Chrome internet browser. Other browsers are not compatible. Phones and tablets can use safari etc.

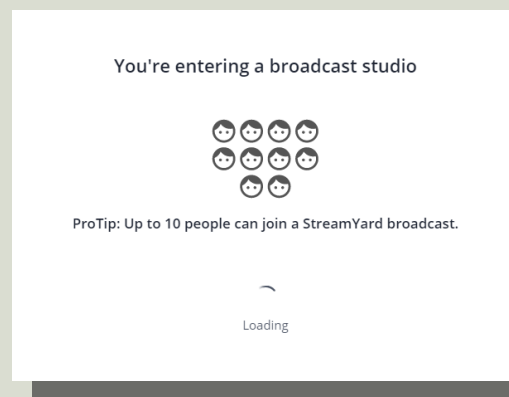
## SETTING UP BROADCAST

### STEP 5

After selecting your destination, create the title for your stream, choose to make it public, unlisted, or private.

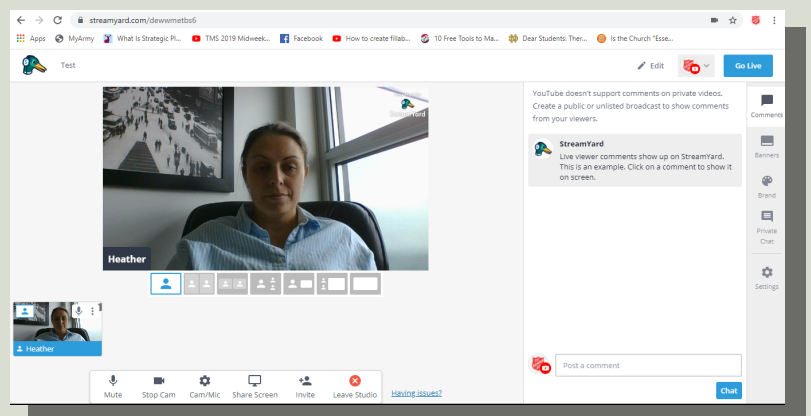
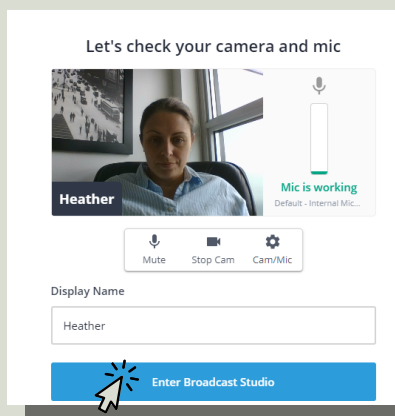


The 'Broadcast to' form includes fields for Title (containing 'Test'), Description (containing 'Test'), and Privacy (set to 'Private'). There is a checkbox for 'Schedule for later' and a blue 'Create Broadcast' button at the bottom, which is being pointed to by a mouse cursor.



### STEP 6

Before entering the broadcast studio, streamyard will preview your camera and mic.

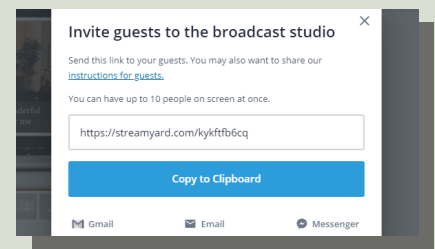
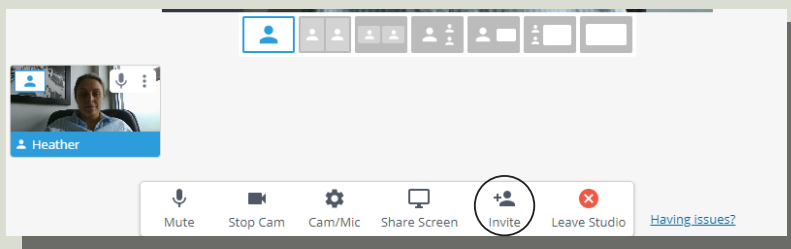


**NOTE:** Even if you setup your stream without selecting a destination at first, you can still go live at any point. Additionally, even when you select your destination, the stream won't go live until you decide inside the studio.

# ADDING CAMERAS

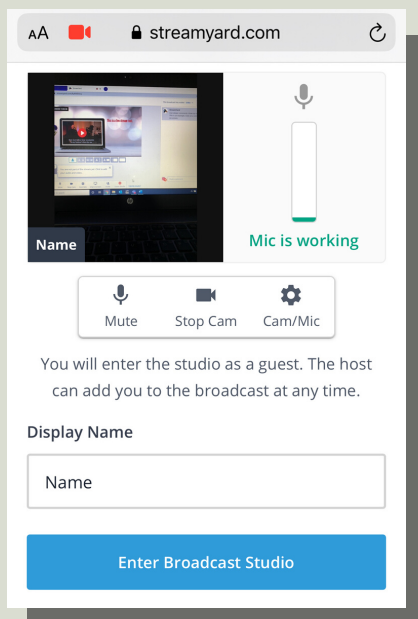
## STEP 7

To add in cameras or other participants, click the “Invite” button at the bottom centre of the broadcast studio and it will provide a web URL/link that you will use to add cameras to join the broadcast. Simply use your phones and tablets as the cameras by going to the URL that the host provides. The host will control when these cameras are live.



## STEP 8

Follow the same steps to enter the broadcast studio on your phones. Allow StreamYard to access your camera and microphone. You can use either front or back cameras. Both horizontal and vertical angles can be used in the same stream. (Horizontal is recommended.)



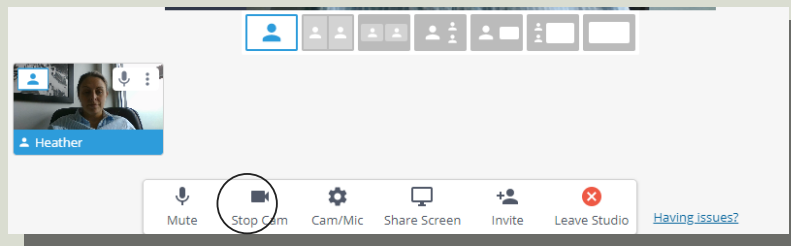
## NOTE:

It is recommended to use headphones so there is no audio echos.

# ADDING POWERPOINT

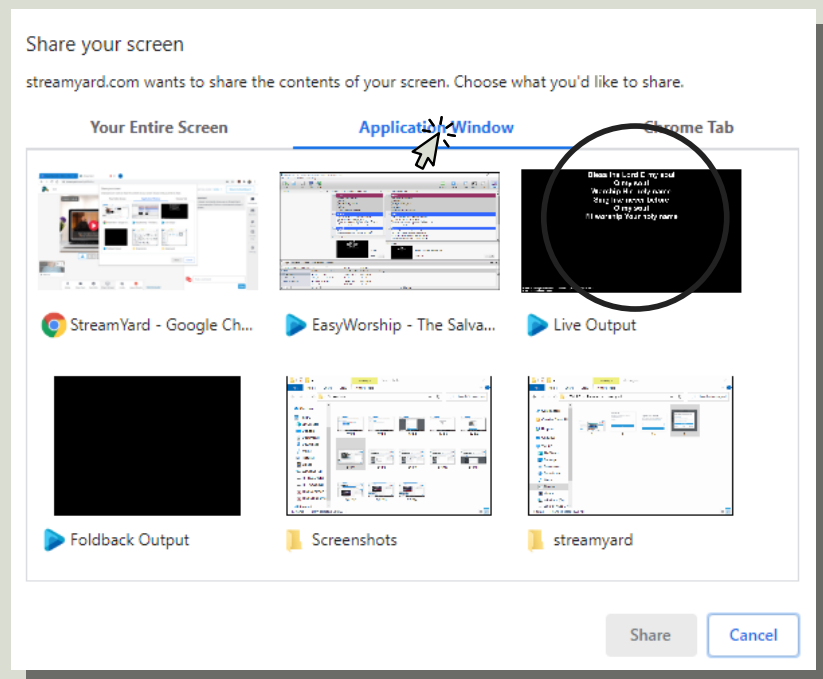
## STEP 9

Connecting your powerpoint/words on screen/media computer to StreamYard is the same process as adding a camera. Use the URL provided to join the backstage. You will then click “share screen”. (It is important that this computer is already displaying in your corps.)



## STEP 10

Select the “application tab” and the window that is displaying your slides. If you are going to be using any audio from this computer, you should also select share audio when sharing your screen.



**NOTE:** The host will be able to select when to share the words on screen to the live stream. They can keep the speaker or musicians on screen while these are being displayed.
