

The heartbeat of this song is the simple confession: "You Are God." It is spoken over darkness and light, over chaos and quiet, over sorrows and laughter, as a declaration of trust in the unchanging nature of God.

Hebrews 13:8 *NIV* says, "Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever," reminding us that God is faithful forevermore. When our circumstances shift, God does not. When our emotions rise and fall, God remains steady. We are continually held by the same faithful presence who was, and is, and always will be.

The song gently names the spaces where we need that truth most: in chaos, in quiet, and in waiting. These are not abstract ideas; they are real moments in our lives. Chaos overwhelms, quiet can feel lonely, and waiting can test our trust. Yet the truth remains: You are God to me.

That phrase brings God close. God is not distant or theoretical. The God who is and was is also the God who lives, loves, and sets me free. Faith deepens when truth becomes personal—when we begin to recognize God's presence in the details of our own lives. From that place, praise becomes a response of trust: "I will praise Your name forevermore, 'cause through all things Your love endures." Praise is no longer dependent on circumstances; it is rooted in God's enduring love. His steadfast love does not fade when life becomes difficult. It holds firm, and so we can hold fast to Him.

The song also lifts our eyes forward. God will wipe away our tears and help us face our fears. He guides, corrects, and makes our pathway straight. He is not only sovereign; He is present and always near.

Today, wherever you find yourself, let this simple truth settle into your heart: You are God. And from that place, let praise rise.

God who is, and was, and will always be, meet me in the very place I am today.

In all that feels uncertain, remind me that You are steady. In all that feels heavy, remind me that Your love endures. Teach my heart to trust You and let my life become praise to Your Name. Because You are God to me. Amen.
