- Chaplain as Counselor

 - F S N - Involved in Crisis Intervention
- Chaplain as Leader of Worship

 - F S N - Maintaining a Sacred Space / Chapel for prayer and meditation
 - F S N - Recognizing Holy Days and Holidays in the year
 - F S N - Conducting Memorial Services / Funerals
 - F S N - Providing for Religious Care, Rites & Rituals
