Please pray for the governments of these nations and for The Salvation Army as we do our part in the rebuilding of what has been damaged or lost.
- 5. We need more competent candidates to respond to the call to become Officers. We need people compelled by the vision of Christ's Kingdom. Please pray for a larger session of cadets to enter the training college in February 2019.
- 6. We are seeking to live out our name which in Māori is 'Te Ope Whakaora' the Army that brings LIFE please pray John 10:10 as you pray for us.
