International Territory Focus: Liberia Command

The work of The Salvation Army was pioneered in Liberia by Canadian officers Major and Mrs. Leonard Miller in May 1988 after more than 10 years of request from local pastors asking to become part of the Army. Originally part of the Ghana and Liberia Territory, the country experienced civil war from 1990-2004. Liberia became a separate command on 1 January 1997 and neighbouring Sierra Leone became part of the command on 1 January 2010, with Captains John and Rosaline Bundu as pioneer officers. The Army is ranked among the fastest growing church in the Republic of Liberia.

23 Corps, 21 outposts, with 2372 Sr. soldiers, 86 adherents and 424 Jr soldiers, 12 schools, and 2 clinics are led by 68 Officers, Aux Captains, Envoys and corps leaders, 14 cadets and 224 employees.

The Canadian SA continues involvement in Liberia, providing assistance for Ebola recovery for those who survived the epidemic in 2014-15.
