The Who, What, Why & How of Spiritual Direction



I have cared for you since you were born. Yes, I carried you before you were born. I will be your God throughout your lifetime—until your hair is white with age. I made you, and I will care for you. I will carry you along and save you.

Intentional spiritual formation is intrinsically valuable for emotional and spiritual well-being, and a significant aid in the prevention of ministry distress and burnout.

What Spiritual Direction Is

- Intentional & confidential
- Focused on the individual, not the Director
- One on one
- Non-directive—prescriptive
- A means of growing in intimacy with God
- For everyone

What Spiritual Direction Is Not

- The same as therapy or counselling
- New age. Rather, it grows out of the practice of the church
- Authoritarian
- A recent fad or the domain of one denomination or age of the church

Who Can Benefit from Spiritual Direction?

- Anyone who desires to deepen his or her relationship with God
- Christian leaders who need to share and be heard
- Those in transition
- Those seeking wisdom and discernment

Why is Spiritual Direction Important?

- It creates a structured opportunity for spiritual self-care
- One's spiritual health is crucial to one's calling
- It enhances worship, stillness, reflection and meditation
- It helps establish a healthy balance between being and doing
- It nurtures a deeper spirituality
- Combats both the isolation and busyness of ministry
- Helps prevent burnout
- It is not a program, but a way of life.
- Gives vitality, significance and perspective to ministry

- A confidential, skilled, non-judgmental listener
- A safe place to share one's heart
