International Territory Focus: Mozambique Territory



Mozambique is one of the poorest and most underdeveloped countries in the world. The only official language of Mozambique is Portuguese, which is spoken mostly as a second language by about half of the population. The largest religion in Mozambique is Christianity, with significant minorities following Islam and African traditional religions.

The Salvation Army’s evangelistic endeavours in Mozambique were pioneered in 1916 by Mozambican converts returning from South Africa. The work was recognized by the Mozambique government in 1986 and officially registered in June 2005. Previously part of the Southern Africa Territory, Mozambique became a separate command on 1 March 2008. It was elevated to a territory on 1 March 2011.
