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TRANSFORMED INTO GOD'S IMAGE - 2017

This year, 2017, promises to be a very exciting one for The Salvation Army in our territory. Women are certainly going to be an important part of whatever God has in store for us. Here are only a few of the things that are coming up:

Bermuda will be closing off its 120th Anniversary year. It began early in 2016 and will culminate with a special weekend February 17-20. There will be a division-wide women's event on the Friday evening to commemorate this milestone. Remember, the first officer sent to Bermuda to consolidate The Salvation Army's work there was a woman: Ensign Lutie Desbrisay. She would later become the first woman Colonel in The Salvation Army.

The World Day of Prayer will be held on the first Friday in March, as it is every year. This year's program



has been written by the women of the Philippines, and the theme is "Am I Being Unfair to You?" Please join with women all around the world as we consider this important topic and pray for each other.

The 1st of July weekend we will have a Congress in Newfoundland (Mount Pearl), with General André Cox and Commissioner Sylvia Cox. They will be accompanied by the Chief of the Staff and the World Secretary for Women's Ministries, Commissioners Brian and Rosalie Peddle. There will also be a special Women's event at the Congress.

September 7-12 will see Pine Lake Camp, Alberta, hosting Canada 150 – The Aboriginal Roundtable. This will be a significant event, solidifying our commitment to the recommendations of the Truth and Reconciliation Commission. Women will play a significant role in helping us to shape our ongoing plans. Please pray for these events and for others as they are announced.

This year, 2017, the International Theme for Women's Ministries will be *Transformed into God's Image*. We are pleased to once again provide you with materials to help you develop this theme in your Women's Ministries programs. As a special treat, the Bible studies are also available in video format as well as in the attached materials.

This theme speaks to women in particular. We are often concerned about our image and we worry over our weight, our hairstyle, our beauty regimen. But the most important thing is to be transformed into the image of God.

Introduction

A few years ago there was a toy called Transformers. I do not know much about them other than you could move some buttons and the one toy would turn into something else. I know they were very popular one year when I was doing Family Services because we had many requests for them. As I was looking at the title for Women's Ministry, I thought of this toy and was reminded that we too are transformed when we allow Jesus into our lives.

I would like for a few moments to share with you three people in the Bible whose lives were transformed because of Christ.

Saul- Acts 9:1-10

- Hated Christians
- Was at every stoning of Christians
- God met him on the road
- Life was changed
- Preached for Christ
- Life was changed

Zaccheus- John 19:1-10

- Tax collector
- Not liked by many because he took more than he should
- Filled his own pockets
- Heard about Jesus but just wanted to see Him and not get too close
- Had two problems going to the place where Jesus would pass by
- Many of the people that he collected taxes from would be there and was afraid of what might happen
- Short could not see over the crowd
- Jesus comes to him
- Life is changed

The Woman at the Well-John 4:1-19,25-30,39

- Met a Jew who spoke to her
- Told her all she had done
- Was given a new life
- Many believed because of her testimony

Transformed into God's Image

I am not sure if you will recall a television program that aired back in 2004 called "Style by Jury". In this show, contestants were given an opportunity for a complete makeover.

At the beginning of the show, we would see individuals who lacked confidence, who did not really take care of themselves, and were poorly dressed. It would be explained that these people were having problems in their workplace or in their personal lives, or they were going through difficult circumstances and were not coping very well.

Throughout the course of the next half hour, we would watch how women and men alike, would be given opportunity to completely transform their physical appearance, as well as receive help to better their circumstances. These people would receive everything from a hair -cut and color, to veneers for their teeth, to one- on- one counseling or coaching, whichever they needed.

The end result would be a completely transformed person! By the end of the show, their lives would be completely turned around.

While I didn't watch the program faithfully, on the odd occasion that I did, I was always amazed at how someone could be so transformed, that they were hardly recognizable!

In a spiritual context, that is exactly what Jesus does for us. He changes us completely!

Well today, I wish I could tell you as women that I have booked a complete makeover for all of you! Unfortunately I cannot. J However, for our time together we will be discussing a far more important transformation...one that has nothing to do with our physical appearance but one that is eternal A transformation that will not only affect *us*, but will also affect everyone *around us*.

Our theme for this Women's Ministries Sunday is "Transformed into God's Image". For the next few moments we will be looking at the difference that Jesus makes in our lives as we become more and more like Him. The more we become like Him, the less we will resemble those in the world who do not know Him

I want to suggest to you that there are **two results** that will be seen in the life of the woman who is "Transformed in His Image."

The first result of the woman who has been transformed, is that she will...

1. See As Jesus Sees

As we become more and more like Him, we see the world through His eyes... The ability to see as Jesus sees will only be cultivated in our lives, when we spend time in Bible study and prayer. His thoughts will become our thoughts, when we learn to intentionally see things through the eyes of Jesus. The only way we can begin to view things as Jesus did is if we study His life, search the scriptures, and seek His face in prayer.

Throughout His ministry, one of the many things that stand out about Jesus is the way He always saw the best in people. He never looked at them as they *were*, but as they *could be* if only they would follow Him and learn from Him. Furthermore, Jesus always saw past the surface, and looked into the heart.

Throughout the scriptures we read story after story of people's lives changed by Jesus. These changes took place because Jesus continually looked past the outward facade, and saw things for what they really were.

Take for example the woman who was caught in the act of adultery. John 8:1-11.

On the surface, she was a sinful woman, who by the law, deserved to be stoned. To the teachers of the law and Pharisees she was a pawn, a means of trapping Jesus. While Jesus would have recognized these two aspects about her, He looked at her and saw so much more... He saw a broken, helpless woman, who was humiliated, ... a woman who thought she would be sentenced to death because of her sin. Jesus not only *saw* what she did, He understood *why* she did it. As a result, He challenges the Pharisees and says that only the one who has never sinned is able to throw the first stone at her. Then He begins writing in the sand. Commentators suggest that He was writing down the sins of those who stood around, those who were condemning her. One by one, they all walked away, until all that was left, is the woman and Jesus. I can picture His eyes filled with love, as He smiles at her and asks in John 8:10, *"Woman, where are they? Has no one condemned you?"* What a sense of relief and joy must have washed over her when she heard Jesus say in John 8:11b, *"Then neither do I condemn you...Go now and leave your life of sin."* What a contrast in how the Pharisees treated her and what Jesus did for her. When we have the eyes of Jesus we too will look at people with compassion and grace. What a beautiful gift Jesus gave her, not only in offering her salvation, but an opportunity to begin again, to start afresh. We can give people the exact same opportunity, but only if we see through the eyes of Jesus...only if we see through the eyes of grace.

The Woman at the well in John 4:1-29, was also changed because of the way Jesus saw her. Scripture tells us that she had come to the well at noon, the hottest time of day. She had gone at that time to avoid all the other women who would daily come to draw water from the well. Throughout her conversation with Jesus, we find out that she has been married five times, and is now living common law. Perhaps to the town folk, she was an easy target for gossip. She may have been seen as a woman who "didn't know *who* she wanted". Furthermore, they may have seen her as a threat to their relationships and may have seen her as flirtatious or a trouble maker. Jesus didn't see her that way. When He looked at her He looked beneath the surface. Perhaps she was attracted to the wrong type of man...maybe the problem was with them.... maybe with her...Something may have happened in her past, and she was unable to carry on a healthy relationship with anyone. Nonetheless, when Jesus looked at her...

*He saw a woman who had five times attempted to find true love, only to have her heart broken...

*He saw a woman who had five times promised to love someone forever, only to have it fall apart....

*He saw a woman who believed, after every marriage...this time... she would finally get it right... This man would be different...this marriage would work.

Jesus truly saw *her* and wanted to help her. He saw her shame...He saw her desperate need for love and acceptance. He saw her broken heart, and her sense of hopelessness.

The love that she had been searching for, He could give her. The self-worth that she longed for, He could provide. And so... He did.

The story ends with the woman running back into the village to tell everyone that she has met Jesus and that nothing will ever be the same. The people she was so desperately trying to avoid, she is running toward. It no longer matters what they think about her. Having met Jesus, her shame is gone. She has discovered that she *is* loved and that her sins are forgiven. She is so excited about her new found life, her new found hope, she can't keep it in.... We see the result in John 4:39. Here we read, "Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony".

A life made new all because Jesus took the time to look beneath the surface. I wonder how many lives we would reach, if we learned to see people through the eyes of Jesus?

When we are transformed in His Image, when we are able to see what Jesus sees, God gives us opportunities to witness for Him, and uses us to share His love and grace with those who do not know Him.

While I have experienced this truth many times in my own life, there is one time in particular that stands out to me. It was a couple of years ago on Christmas Eve and I was doing some last minute shopping. I had gone to the Jewellery counter of a certain store, hoping to purchase a new watch for my husband. He had broken his, a day or two before, and I thought I would surprise him with a new watch in his stocking. The line up was somewhat long so I began looking at the other jewellery on display. I noted that the clerk behind the counter appeared distracted and while she wore a smile, it was clearly a fake one. I asked the Lord to help me see her through His eyes and waited my turn in line. By the time I got to the cash, everyone else had left and we were the only two people left there. After I had made my purchase, I attempted a conversation with her and asked if she had made any plans for Christmas. When she responded, I commented that she looked a little sad and asked if there was anything I could do for her. She started to cry and explained that her husband had gotten laid off a few weeks earlier and that her job would only last through the Christmas rush. She admitted that they were struggling financially and were uncertain of what the New Year would bring. I had a wonderful opportunity to share God's love with her and even had a prayer with her there in the store. I then gave her the contact name for The Salvation Army Officer in her town and assured her that we would do everything we could to help her. She expressed her appreciation for my help and suggested that God must be watching over her. As I walked away, I noted that this time... her smile was genuine. Had I dismissed this lady as someone who was working for minimum wage and simply biding her time, I would have missed the real issue. However, when I prayed to see her through Jesus' eyes, I received a blessing, the woman received encouragement and practical help for her problem and God received the glory.

Who has God been putting in your path in these days? Who do you need to see through the eyes of Jesus? Perhaps the quiet lady at work who often sits alone, is waiting for someone to invite her to coffee. Maybe the homeless lady who you pass on your way home from work, would love for someone to notice her and have a chat. Could it be that the elderly lady at church, whose children live far away, would love it if you would visit her and share a cup of tea? What about the person who works on cash at your local grocery store who needs a friend? Attempt to go out of your way to speak to the family who live across the street, bake cookies or invite them in for dinner.

What about the people closest to you? Your teenage son or daughter may be going through a difficult time. Ask God to provide an opportunity where you can talk to him/her one on one. The possibilities of ministry are endless when we are able to see through the eyes of Jesus. And this is only possible when we allow ourselves to be "transformed in His image" and become more and more like Him.

Brandon Heath, a Christian Artist wrote a song entitled "Give me your eyes". This song ties in nicely with what we have been discussing. In this song he prays for the eyes of Jesus so that he can see past the surface, and truly see the person. As women who are being transformed in His Image, may our prayer also be....

Give me Your eyes for just one second Give me Your eyes so I can see Everything that I keep missing Give me Your love for humanity Give me Your arms for the broken-hearted The ones that are far beyond my reach Give me Your heart for the ones forgotten Give me Your eyes so I can see

> Step out on a busy street See a girl and our eyes meet Does her best to smile at me To hide what's underneath There's a man just to her right Black suit and a bright red tie Too ashamed to tell his wife He's out of work, he's buyin' time

2. Live As Jesus Lived

There are various scriptures that we could look to, that would give us great insight into the way Jesus lived, the way He acted and reacted toward people. Everything we learn from Him teaches us to act differently than the culture around us suggests.

For example, how did Jesus respond when He was faced with hurt and betrayal? How did He react to Peter who would deny Him, or Judas who would betray Him? We find our answer in John 13:1-17, one of the most beautiful and sacred scenes in all of scripture...He washed their feet.

What was Jesus' reaction to those who were crucifying Him? ... He showed them love and forgiveness. In the midst of the soldiers gambling for His clothes, and the crowd insulting Him, Luke records Jesus as saying, In Luke 23:34 "³⁴ "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what they are doing." We too must show love and forgiveness to others.

Paul reminds us in Ephesians 4:30-32 that when we act in an unloving manner, we grieve the Holy Spirit. The ERV translation puts it this way....

^{"30} And don't make the Holy Spirit sad. God gave you his Spirit as proof that you belong to him and that he will keep you safe until the day he makes you free. ³¹ Never be bitter, angry, or mad. Never shout angrily or say things to hurt others. Never do anything evil. ³² Be kind and loving to each other. Forgive each other the same as God forgave you through Christ."

The culture of Jesus' day and the one we live in today, would tell us to seek revenge on those who hurt us, to attempt to inflict as much pain on them, as they had inflicted on us. This is not the way Jesus lived His life and not the way we are to live ours. Jesus is very clear on how we ought to treat people. In fact Jesus tells us exactly how to treat those who wrong us in Matthew 5:43-48. He says,

^{"43} You have heard that it was said, 'Love your neighbor^[1] and hate your enemy.' ⁴⁴ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, ⁴⁵ that you may be children of your Father in heaven. He causes his sun to rise on the evil and the good, and sends rain on the righteous and the unrighteous. ⁴⁶ If you love those who love you, what reward will you get? Are not even the tax collectors doing that? ⁴⁷ And if you greet only your own people, what are you doing more than others? Do not even pagans do that? ⁴⁸ Be perfect, therefore, as your heavenly Father is perfect."(NIV)

Not only does Jesus tell us to live this way, but He exemplified it in His own living. Everything Jesus did, everything He said, He did in love.

We must live our lives in the same way. The real test of a Christian character is not loving those who love us, but loving those who do not. If we only love those who love us and are kind to those who are kind to us we are no different than those who don't know God. As we become more like Jesus however, we learn to love as He loved and live as He lived.

Jesus reminds us in John 13:34-35 (NIV) that when we love others, they will know that we belong to Him. ³⁴ "A new command I give you: Love one another. As I have loved you, so you must love one another. ³⁵ By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

In other words, when we are "Transformed in His Image" we are able to live as Jesus lived and show others the unconditional love that He has shown to us. If we do this, other people will see Jesus in us and know that we serve Him. This truth is best illustrated in a story that I found in an old Daily Bread....

A little lame boy was once hurrying to catch a train. In the press of the crowd he experienced real difficulty in manipulating his crutches, especially as he was carrying a basket full of fruit and candy.

As the passengers rushed along, one hit the basket by mistake, knocking oranges, apples, and candy bars in all directions. The man who caused the accident paused only long enough to scold the cripple for getting in his way.

Another gentleman, seeing the boy's distress, went to his aid. Quickly he picked up the fruit and added a silver dollar to the collection, saying, 'I'm sorry, sonny ! I hope this makes up a little!"

With a smile he was on his way. The young boy who had seldom been the recipient of such kindness called after the 'good Samaritan' in gratitude and awe, 'Mister – please sir, are you Jesus?' 'No, I'm only one of His followers,' replied his new-found friend" How humbled the man must have felt.

Who needs to see Jesus in you today? Perhaps you know of someone going through a difficult time, and you can show God's love to them. Is there someone you need to forgive? Is there someone you need to serve? Perhaps there is a past grudge you need to let go of... once and for all. Is there a co-worker with whom you have shared unkind words? Ask for forgiveness. Think of someone you find difficult to love and make an intentional effort to show kindness to them. We all have family members outside the kingdom, ask God to give you words of grace to share with them. Wherever today takes you, may others see Jesus in you because you live the way Jesus lives.

By way of pulling everything together...This morning we have discussed two results of being Transformed in His Image? <u>1. We See as Jesus Sees</u> <u>2. We Live as Jesus lived.</u>

As we spend quiet time in prayer before God, Let's sing the words of the following chorus as a prayer...

"Jesus I long to be like you, loving in every way. Jesus I need to be like you.

Please hear me as I pray.

You are my pattern for living.

Your way of life is my goal...

Patient and kind and forgiving, under the Spirit's control.

Transform my life from within Lord.

Come and my heat refine. You are my pattern for living.

Give me a love like Thine."

DAY 1: TRANSFORMATION IS FOR EVERYONE!

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "*BUT WE ALL*, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit." Chris Tomlin adds a chorus to the old classic, When I Survey the Wondrous Cross, that gives us insight into how the transformation referred to in the above verse happens:

O the wonderful cross, O the wonderful cross

Bids me come and die and find that I may truly live

O the wonderful cross, O the wonderful cross

All who gather here by grace draw near and bless Your name

That's it! God's part and our response: We see the cross, understand by the moving of the Spirit in our lives what it means, commit ourselves to die to all that is you and me; and find new life in the resurrection power of Jesus.

2 Corinthians 5:17 says: Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a new creation. The old has passed away; behold, the new has come.

The word **'anyone'** assures us of the universality of the Gospel transformation message. There are no restrictions as to who can be recreated – not race, class, intelligence level, etc.

The most difficult prayer for us to say is, "Not my will, but Thine be done." But according to the Word of God, it's not an option. Luke 9:23: *"Then He* [Jesus] *said to them all: Whoever wants to be my disciple must deny themselves and take up their cross daily and follow me."* God uses our will and our choices to work out this amazing transformation from the inside out. At a meeting of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Bobby Richardson, former New York Yankee second baseman, offered up this prayer: "Dear God, Your will, nothing more, nothing less, nothing else. Amen."

Charles Spurgeon said: I' know no language, I believe there is none, that can express a greater or more thorough and more radical renewal, than that which is expressed in the term, 'a new creature.'"Because Jesus wasn't restricted by death, but rose again, when we are born again by His Holy Spirit, we too inherit resurrection life."

The Christian life is not about us – it's all about Christ... it's about putting God's will over our will... putting Christ first above everything else, no matter what it costs us... it's the realization that we are in this together as the body of Christ, we are His servants, and our goal is to live for Him and glorify Him in everything we do. If we choose a nice, comfortable, life, over pursuing everything that God has planned for us, we will be cheating God, ourselves and the world. Don't settle for anything less than God's plan for you. Are you ready to let go of whatever stands between you and God? Count the cost. Take a deep breath. Only the brave will pray "Your will be done." But those four words have the power to change your life and your world forever.

Prayer

Father, I pray that this will be the day when I finally come to the end of self-rule. I confess that I want the approval of others, I want to be recognized and to prove I'm important and that I'm a good person. Today, I lay it all at Your feet and pray to die to all the plans I have for myself. From now on in my life, it will be only Your way and plans that matter. I bow in submission to You and surrender my own agenda; as I pray that You will work through my life as a member of Your body, the church, to grow me for Your glory and honor. Dear God, Your will, nothing more, nothing less, nothing else. In Jesus' name, Amen.

DAY 2: TRANSFORMATION IS GENUINE

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "But we all, WITH UNVEILED FACE, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

Exodus 34 (selected verses): "... When Moses came down from Mount Sinai carrying the two Tablets of The Testimony, he didn't know that the skin of his face glowed because he had been speaking with God. Aaron and all the Israelites ... held back, afraid to get close to him. .. and Moses talked with them. When Moses finished speaking with them, he put a veil over his face, but when he went into the presence of God to speak with Him, he removed the veil until he came out. When he came out and told the Israelites what he had been commanded, they would see Moses' face, its skin glowing, and then he would again put the veil on his face until he went back in to speak with God."

Paul explains in **2** Corinthians 3:13; "Therefore since we have such hope, we use great boldness of speech – unlike Moses, who put a veil over his face so that the children of Israel could not look steadily at the end of what was passing away." The Old Covenant based on the blood of animals for atonement in the Tabernacle and Temple, was passing away; to be replaced by the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's blood once and for all, for the sins of the whole world on Calvary. Now, today, under this New Covenant, we enter into the presence of God without a veil over our faces, and go out to minister boldly in His name with the constant presence of the Holy Spirit in our hearts.

"God, who said, 'Let light shine out of darkness,' has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ" (2 Corinthians 4:6). Moses' face, after a time, lost the glow, 2 Corinthians 3:7: "Now if the ministry that brought death, which was engraved in letters on stone, came with glory, so that the Israelites could not look steadily at the face of Moses because of its glory, transitory though it was." But we who are now transformed from the inside out have the power to continually shine for Jesus. Our transformation happens when we take time to consciously and intentionally 'behold' the Lord. It's not referring to a quick glance, or a short time in His presence – but living in an attitude of meditation and worship every day as we move about in this world. It's intentionally living 'in Christ'.

Philippians 4:8 tells us where our focus should be: *"Finally, brethren, whatever things are true, whatever things are noble, whatever things are just, whatever things are pure, whatever things are lovely, whatever things are of good report, if there is any virtue and if there is anything praiseworthy—meditate on these things." And then Colossians 3:1-2: <i>"If then you were raised with Christ, seek those things on the earth."* Unfortunately our lives get so crazy busy that our focus turns to other things and we find it difficult to truly 'behold' and wait on the Lord. And without it, we can't know what real transformation is. The lines get blurred and the honesty, and integrity and genuineness of Christ is veiled to us and to others to whom God calls us as an example of Himself.

PRAYER:

Lord, remove the veil from my mind today, that through Scripture and by your freeing Spirit, I might see your glory, and be empowered to share Your good news genuinely and effectively with those around me. Amen.

DAY 3: TRANSFORMATION IS REVEALING

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "But we all, with unveiled face, BEHOLDING AS IN A MIRROR THE GLORY OF THE LORD, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

When we're getting ready to go out somewhere, we make sure that our hair is combed right, we're dressed appropriately, and we look our best. Conventional mirrors work by blocking the passage of light (or sound, or water, or radio waves), and so they have no choice but to reflect. The reflection is never perfect, with some energy being absorbed by the material, or scattered in different directions. Mirrors also reverse right and left. But for our purposes, checking our hair, or makeup, or how a new outfit fits, it doesn't matter. They are 'perfect enough' to serve our purposes.

When we're away from the mirror, we might forget what we look like, but the truth becomes clear when we actually look. Sometimes our lives are a pretense. We try to live and act like someone we're not. We put on airs to be accepted and esteemed. But in the presence of Jesus, all is stripped away and we stand before Him as we are – honest, true, warts and all.

Exodus 33:11 says: *The Lord would speak to Moses face to face, as one speaks to a friend.* "When someone you trust speaks to you face to face, you are inclined to listen intently, and then it's likely that the words they say will mean more and be clearer. It was even more so as God spoke to Moses. In Numbers 12:8, God Himself explains the clarity of His conversations with Moses: "With him I speak face to face, clearly and not in riddles; he sees the form of the LORD." Moses had special insight into the words of the Lord.

There is a discernment of the Spirit that God gives to those who enter into friendship with Him, so that we see ourselves, and then see the will and way of the Lord in a truer sense. In **Ephesians 1:18** from The Living Translation Paul makes this prayer: "I pray that your hearts will be flooded with light so that you can understand the confident hope he has given to those he called--his holy people who are his rich and glorious inheritance."

But we have to know that even with this light, we are still inhibited by our human, fallen nature. This means that our knowledge of the things of God is not yet perfect and complete. Even with the wonderful revelations Paul received and understood, in **1 Corinthians 13:12** he says this: *"For now we see only a reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known."* Some glorious day we will literally see our Lord – not just like a poor reflection in a mirror. We will stand in His presence.

We might go through times of darkness and confusion now, because our knowledge is so limited, and our view is distorted. But the closer we get to the Lord – the deeper and more intense our communion is with Him, the more our earthbound selves are wrenched from our worldly anchors. The more our thoughts turn toward the reality of Heaven; the more these words become true in our experience: 'The things of earth, that cause our hearts to tremble; remembered there will only bring a smile." All the things we now know in part, we will then know completely; we'll have a clear view of the things that now are cloudy and dim. We'll know the answers to all the questions our hearts long for. Then we will know in the same way as God knows us now. How awesome is that!

PRAYER:

O God of Heaven, I honor You today as the all wise, ever present, and all powerful Lord of my life. Your works and ways go far beyond my human wisdom. Thank You for stooping to my need and changing my life. Help me to truly see myself as you reveal Yourself to me. Forgive the times I have ignored Your glory. I commit myself to You today to turn the thoughts and intentions of my heart to Your way. May others see Your reflection through me. In the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.

DAY 4: TRANSFORMATION IS CONTINUOUS

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: *"But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, ARE BEING TRANSFORMED into the same image from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."*

I would venture to say that it would be hard to find someone who didn't have a longing in their heart for change. Deep inside us, a voice tells us we're not what we should be. A lot of us have been changed by Jesus. But we need to remind ourselves that though our salvation happens right away when we confess our sins and put our trust in Christ, our total transformation is a process.

We see ourselves in a clearer light because we've allowed His Holy Spirit to cleanse our hearts and reveal that we need to be conformed to His image. He's showed up things we would naturally overlook in ourselves – bad habits, anger, fear, bitterness, failures in relationships. We have a new understanding of ourselves, a new sense of our life's purpose – we know God better, and we are learning to love Him more. The wonder of the Spirit's work in us is that we can be ever moving to new heights of glory – growing up in Him, experiencing new courage, new patience, new direction. Where once we would hide our face in the presence of God because of the guilt of our sin – now by His grace we are free to come boldly to Him! *"Where the Spirit of the Lord is, there is freedom."* (2 Corinthians 3:17)

So we have been transformed. But we're told that we are 'being' transformed. And yet, the truth is, we're still human and every day we face the problems of life, as well as our tendency to stray from God's way. It's because there's still inside of us a tendency to sin—a sin principle—that remains even when we're redeemed. There's a wonderful verse in Psalm 103 that reminds us that God knows exactly what we're like. *"For he knows our frame; he remembers that we are dust."* (ESV). God knows what we're made of and what makes us tick; what we think and feel and how often we fail. That's why Paul describes our ongoing relationship with Christ as 'being transformed'. There's no need to be stuck in a rut, to feel hopeless or discouraged. We're transformed and as we continue to commit our lives totally to Him we are constantly transforming by the living Christ! There's only one source of lasting change, and it's not you or me – it's God alone: Philippians 2:13: *"for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose."*

God never stops conforming us to the image of his Son (that's *sanctification!*). He has determined to complete His work, and will meet all our needs. **Philippians 4:19:** "*And my God shall supply all your need according to His riches in glory by Christ Jesus.*" Wow! That's such a powerful truth; and accepting the truth of it from God by faith is life-changing.

Paul says in **Galatians 2:20 (ESV):** "I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me." Before his born-again experience Paul lived by faith in what he could do for God. He was a leading Pharisee, who followed all the rules and laws, and though he was right. But when he met Jesus on the Damascus Road, he realized he had it all wrong. It wasn't his good works or following the rules that made him right with God; it was all about what Jesus did for him. After that, he lived a new life, by faith in Jesus alone, no longer trusting himself, but trusting the power of God to work through Him and make His life meaningful and productive for the Kingdom. God can and will do it again, for you!

Prayer: Dear Heavenly Father, I thank and praise You that You are my living Lord and loving Savior. Thank You for my salvation in Christ and for the freedom I have in Him. Give me Your peace that passes all understanding in my heart... which alone can set me free from the worries and anxieties of life. Jesus, break even more of the chains of my insecurity and self-doubt. Help me throw off the grave-clothes of shame and feelings of incompetency, about important things in life. Heal my heart wounds, and free me from any roots of bitterness, so I can truly reflect Your glory. Praise you, Lord, that You have promised to continue to transform my life! In Your holy name I pray. Amen.

DAY 5: TRANSFORMATION CHANGES EVERYTHING

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed INTO THE SAME IMAGE from glory to glory, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

Psalm 8:4-6 summarizes what "image of God" means: "What is man that You are mindful of him, and the son of man that You visit him? For You have made him a little lower than the angels, and You have crowned him with glory and honor. You have made him to have dominion over the works of Your hands; You have put all things under his feet."

"What is man?" Evolution answers that man is a meaningless, purposeless, biological accident. But in **Genesis 1:26-27** God says: *"Let us make humankind in our image, according to our likeness, and let them have dominion over the fish, birds, cattle, wild animals, creeping things"* (NRSV). This is God's plan for man. The word 'image' in Greek is 'eikon', the same word we get our word 'icon' from. The definition of icon that we're probably most familiar with now is: "a small picture or symbol on a computer screen that represents a function that the computer can perform." How appropriate this meaning is for comparing how we are to be when we're transformed by the power of the Lord. We are living icons of what God's power can do – living examples of Christlikeness – showing the world what Jesus is like! When people 'click on us' or get to know us, they find we're all about Jesus. We lead them to Him – to experience all that He can do for them.

So, man was created in the image of God. But in **Genesis 3** we see that man sinned; and the image of God in him was marred. Paul tells us in **Romans 5** that this marred image or sinful nature was passed on to every person born since Adam. These verses tell us that we have a corrupt nature: **Romans 3:23**: "for all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God"; **1 John 1:8**: "If we say we have no sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in us."; Jeremiah 17:9: "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?" Jesus said in John 3:7: "Do not marvel that I said to you, 'You must be born again.'" That's why, when Paul was explaining to the Ephesians what their condition was before they accepted Jesus, he says in **Ephesians 2:12**: ". . .at that time you were without Christ, being aliens form the commonwealth of Israel, and strangers from the covenants of promise, having no hope and without God in the world."

Then at exactly the right time, God sent His Son Jesus, fulfilling His plan to restore and transform His image through Him. **Hebrews 1:3:** "*The Son is the radiance of God's glory and the exact representation of his being, sustaining all things by his powerful word. After he had provided purification for sins, he sat down at the right hand of the Majesty in heaven*"; **Colossians 1:15:** "*The Son is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn over all creation.*" But the only way the image of God can be restored in us is if we agree with the way God views our sinful condition, and accept Jesus Christ and His work on Calvary as our atoning sacrifice for sin. Paul tells us in **Colossians 3:10** that because we have been born again by the Spirit of God through Jesus Christ, that we have: "*put on the new man, who is being renewed to a true knowledge according to the image of the one who created him.*" This teaching is not always accepted in our world, but we still need to be sure of what the Bible says and remain uncompromising when it comes to the truth. So God gives us power to outwardly express His true character by the way we live and act. To present ourselves to the world as an icon of Him. What a wonderful, powerful, and transforming truth that is! As Francis of Assisi once famously said: 'Preach the gospel all the time, use words if you have to."

PRAYER

Dear Lord God, Thank you for accepting my brokenness and recreating me in Your image. May others see the reflection of Your beauty in my life. Thank You for every reminder of the power that is mine in You to live out the calling you have placed on me. I pray that your likeness will be reflected in all that I am, and all that I do. In the name of Jesus. Amen.



DAY 6: TRANSFORMATION IS GLORIOUS

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image FROM GLORY TO GLORY, just as from the Lord, the Spirit."

One meaning of the word, "glory" from the Hebrew, is "to be heavy" or "to weigh upon." When we hear God's Word and are taught by His Spirit, we sense the weight of His holy presence and glory. The weight of glory that we're called to is "eternal. Paul encourages us with these words in **2** Corinthians **4:17:** "*For this slight momentary affliction is preparing for us an eternal weight of glory beyond all comparison*". Anything we go through in this life cannot compare with the glory God has prepared for us in Heaven. But God's desire for us is to experience His glory continually here on earth and so He gives us revelations of it even in the difficulties of life. It was true for Moses.

God called Moses to lead the whole nation of Israel through the wilderness, but it wasn't easy going. The whole way there were moanings and grumblings among them. Plus the enemy nations around them wanted to kill them all. In **Exodus 33:12-13** we read: "Moses said to the LORD, "You have been telling me, 'Lead these people,' but you have not let me know whom you will send with me. You have said, 'I know you by name and you have found favor with me.' If you are pleased with me, teach me your ways so I may know you and continue to find favor with you. Remember that this nation is your people." God's answer to Moses' cry for help in **verse 14** was: "My Presence will go with you, and I will give you rest." That wonderful promise is ours too. If we walk by faith, His presence is always with us. We can go from glory to glory.

In **Exodus 33:15-17** we see that Moses had a deep conviction that if he wasn't surrounded by the glory of God, there was no use doing anything. He says: "*If your Presence does not go with us, do not send us up from here. How will anyone know that you are pleased with me and with your people unless you go with us? What else will distinguish me and your people from all the other people on the face of the earth?"* In **verse** 17 God says to Moses: "*I will do the very thing you have asked, because I am pleased with you and I know you by name.*" The God of Glory wants to know us by name – to know us by **HIS** name – as people who crave to know His presence and show His glory by testifying with our lives to others. And He will say the same thing He said to Moses when we're serious about experiencing His glory.

Moses went on to ask God to show him His glory, and we see in **Exodus 34:6-7:** "And He passed in front of Moses, proclaiming, 'The Lord, the Lord, the compassionate and gracious God, show to anger, abounding in love and faithfulness, maintaining love to thousands, and forgiving wickedness, rebellion and sin. Yet He does not leave the guilty unpunished; he punishes the children and their children for the sin of the fathers to the third and fourth generation."

Moses received a total revelation of the nature of God – His love, mercy, faithfulness along with His complete righteousness and judgment! To move from glory to glory in our experience with the Lord requires a revelation of Who He is. Just to assume Who God really is leads to confusion and wrong thinking. There are resources that can help us in our walk with the Lord, but there's no substitute for face to face encounters with Him in the quiet place, sincerely and humbly seeking and placing all our hope in His glory. It's there that His Holy Spirit transforms us from the inside out *"from one degree of glory to another;"* opening our eyes to more of his nature and character, revealing to us how He wants to be known! Only then can we truly show the world His glory.

PRAYER: Father, there is nothing in heaven nor on earth that can compare with the amazing glory and grace. Teach me Lord to seek You with all my heart so that I might know you, learn to love you more, and become like you. Thank you for the riches you have laid up for me in Heaven. May those around me see Your glory in me and be drawn to love and serve you. Amen

DAY 7: TRANSFORMATION IS FROM THE HOLY SPIRIT

2 Corinthians 3:17&18: "But we all, with unveiled face, beholding as in a mirror the glory of the Lord, are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory, JUST AS FROM THE LORD, THE SPIRIT."

The transformation we experience in Christ is a work of the Holy Spirit and will show in our lives only by His power: "Just as from the Lord, the Spirit": **Philippians 2:13:** "for it is God who works in you to will and to act in order to fulfill his good purpose."

Paul tells us in **Romans 8:29**: For those God foreknew he also predestined to be conformed to the likeness of his Son, that he might be the firstborn among many brothers."

The word "conformed" here means having a similar form, nature, or style. Salvation instantly brought us into a holy relationship with God through the sacrifice of Jesus on the cross, and by the Holy Spirit He works in us to make us more and more like Him. **Hebrews 10:14:** *"For by one sacrifice He has made perfect forever those who are being made holy."*

This is sanctification. We are "being made holy" as the Spirit works out our transformation day by day and moment by moment. Only by the power of the Holy Spirit can we obey what Paul tells us in **Galatians 5:16**, **22-23** is required of us as God's people: "Live by the Spirit, I say, and do not gratify the desires of the flesh The fruit of the spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, self-control." Jesus wants to turn us into His likeness, which will make us more 'us' than we've ever been – more complete, more fulfilled, more fruitful! He wants to infuse us with His life and power, more and more every day. Jesus Himself makes it plain in John 10:10: "I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full." C.S. Lewis writes: "If we're willing, He will make the feeblest and filthiest of us into a dazzling, radiant, immortal creature, pulsating all through with such energy, joy and wisdom and love as we cannot now imagine – a bright, stainless mirror, which reflects back to God perfectly His own boundless power, delight and goodness."

So many miss out on this total transformation because they think it's too good to be true, or Satan has planted a little voice in our heads that says we'll never be good enough or somehow has convinced us to settle for less than God intends for us. But just as God seems too good to be true; too true to be real; too much of an answer for our crippled lives to be believed – and yet He absolutely is all this and more – so this transforming power by His Holy spirit is ours today.

Anne Graham Lotz said: "The One who spoke all things into existence, the One who transformed earth from a formless blob, to a beautiful place that reflected His own image—is the same person who has power today to transform your life."

If we've already believed, we can trust Him to complete His work in us. If we have not submitted ourselves to God's control we can reach out in faith for His transforming salvation as the first step of the journey. Then, the Holy Spirit will take us on a rocky ride through this life. He'll lead us into situations and experiences where we'll even wonder at times if we'll survive. And it will cost us – everything we are and have. But the path where He leads is already strewn with grace. God will be there. He will pick us up when we fall – give us words of love and encouragement through His Word – and be with us all the way.

PRAYER: Gracious Lord, give me a vision of the transforming power available to me now. Breathe into me afresh the power of Your Holy Spirit. I submit myself fully to You and trust you to finish your work in me until that glorious day when I stand complete in Your Holy presence. Thank You because Your ways are perfect.

Amen.

Women's Bible Study #1 - The Season of Winter

Ice Breaker Discussion

What do you like about living in Canada?

In this vast country there are various climate differences. If you lived on the west coast in British Columbia or in Bermuda, it is a normal occurrence for green grass to appear and some flowers to bloom even in the winter months. However if you live in most other provinces, the months of winter produce strong winds and white snow covers the green grass.

We sometimes think of the seasons in terms of chronological years; years of youth is **spring**, early adulthood is **summer**, middle age is **fall** and the 'golden years' are **winter**.

In the next four studies we will examine the seasons of life as it pertains to our spiritual life.

This study is based on the book <u>Spiritual Rhythm</u> by Mark Buchanan. In his book he indicates that we live in a world of rhythm. It is so important to have balance in life, balance in work and rest, and time to refrain from work. He says life is more about rhythm than balance.

Question: What are some aspects of life that have a rhythm to them?

(i.e. day /night, ocean's ebb and flow)

If you have taken a ride in a canoe you realize that you need balance to not only get in the boat but to enjoy the smooth ride. However, you need rhythm when you paddle. The balance flows out of the rhythm you experience. There is progress when the paddles have a rhythm and the movement is deliberate.

<u>Purpose of the Study</u>:

During these Bible Studies we will discover together how the rhythm of the seasons allows us to experience spiritual growth as we are transformed in His image.

It is important to realize that we don't experience these seasons in any specific order nor do they have a definite length of time. We may go from one season to another in a short period of time or we may stay in a particular season for longer. Everyone is unique in how they move from one season to another.

Now let us begin...

Introduction: This psalm is written by the sons of Korah. It is customary for these brothers to write psalms that are happy, upbeat, reasons for celebration. They are written for dancing, love songs, anthems. This psalm is not like any other that they have written. The Sons of Korah have experienced God in the light, but in this psalm it is as if they have never experienced any blessing from the hand of God.

Take time to read Psalm 88

1st time – on your own, silently 2nd time – read the Psalm together 3rd time – one person (optional)

Psalm 88 describes a person in winter of the soul.

Absence of Light

Identify the verses from this psalm that illustrate the psalmist is experiencing dark times.-----

Absence of God

It would seem that the psalmist knows about God and his character, but at this point it seems that God is hidden from him.

2. State the attributes of God that the psalmist mentions.

Has there been a time in your life when God seemed absent and hidden from you?

Absence of Friends

Winter is friendless

List the various emotions that the psalmist is experiencing as a result of being friendless.

Is it possible to experience these emotions even in a crowd, at church, at Bible Study, at choir practice etc?

What is the psalmist accusing God of in verse 8, 18?

How might you experience a type of death during the winter of your soul? How might that show up in your life?

Can you recall a time when something brought winter to your soul? Eg. Moving, loss of relationship, a death of a loved one?

How can you link winter of the soul with Phil. 3:10-11?

Activities During winter

As a young mom living in Winnipeg in the '70s, I remember the snow storms that kept us in doors for days. Narrow tracks in the snow covered streets allowed us to walk to the nearby convenience store for some essentials. During those storms we got the shovels out and started clearing the walkways and driveways. I have to admit it, I enjoyed the exercise.

There's work to do in winter, it requires some exercise though.

Prayer

4. Has there been a time in your life when you found it difficult to pray?

During the winter of your soul, what spurs you on to prayer?

The psalmist seems to push himself beyond his circumstances and cries out to God for help.

Think about this:

12. Who do you go to when you need someone to pray for you and with you?

Someone who has endured a long hard winter of the soul is someone who has a deep faith as a result of that dark experience.

<u>Pruning</u>

This spring we pruned, cut back entirely the Virginia creeper on our pergola. It was growing uncontrollably. However, before long, new leaves, new growth started to appear despite our cutting back and despite our pruning. It survived...and in fact the leaves are even bigger and the vine looks healthier.

13. Look at 2 Corinthians 4. What does Paul say about the pruning process during winter? When have you experienced pruning in your life? What was the fruit that was produced?

<u>Waiting</u>

Another activity for winter is waiting.

15. If you are in the wintertime of your soul, is there something that you are waiting for?

Only during this season does your faith grow.

Quote from Mark Buchanan

"Most of us have had our deepest encounters with Christ not on the mountaintops but in valley floors." Pg. 40

It sounds like the psalmist has been afflicted for a long time and has waited to see light again.

16. What verses in Psalm 88 speak of the psalmist's suffering through his life.

Time to Reflect

Women's Bible Study #2- The Season of Spring

DISCUSS:

When you think of the season of spring, what are some words or phrases that come to mind?

Spring is a season of **Renewal.** It comes out of a season of dryness and wilderness. Maybe you have experienced some loss, poor health, or a deep valley of depression. Maybe you have come through a season of conflict in your home, in the church, or in the neighbourhood. Whatever it was, your heart may have become bitter, like the frozen ground of winter and then one day suddenly, God broke the ground and renewal took place.

DISCOVER:

Read Isaiah 35

1st Reading – silently

 2^{nd} Reading – the leader will read while others close their eyes and try and imagine the scene that is being described.

Emotional Renewal - verses 1-4

Emotions that were dormant now experience a spring-like restoration to healing.

Look at verses 1-2 and discover some of the 'before and after' images during this season.

Look at verses 3-4 and discover another 'before and after' image.

What emotion comes to your mind when you read these verses?

Spring is a time of emotional renewal, there is JOY.

In other seasons you may experience hurts that have wounded your spirit, injured your character or ruined your reputation.

What are some of the obvious images of physical restoration that you see in these verses?

The Lord is a man for all seasons. He has experienced the winter, (Man of Sorrows). He knew suffering. He was close to the brokenhearted.

"Jesus reserves his deepest intimacy for winter. But he displays his greatest handiwork in spring." Mark Buchanan- <u>Spiritual Rhythm</u>, pg 82

Most of us have our deepest encounters with Christ not on the mountain top but in the valley floors. We discovered this truth previously in discussing the season of winter.

Spiritual/Moral Renewal - verses 8-10

I am sure you know about spring cleaning! In a spiritual sense God gives us a thorough cleaning – cleaning from top to bottom during this season. We all know the areas where we need the Lord to come in and scour the dirt and grime away. There might be areas where we have allowed a bitter root or some poisonous attitude to come in, or some dirty secret or habit to take hold.

Mark Buchanan talks about a springtime experience that he went through. It wasn't like he had 'wallowed' in sin, but he had 'wallowed' in self pity. He had lost the joy of his salvation and had a scar of cynicism on the wound. But then the Lord renewed him and cynicism gave way to hope, the joy of his salvation came back.

These verses have always provided a beautiful image.

Who are on this Holy Highway?

- What words would you use to describe this road?
- During the season of Spring in your spiritual life, you experience emotional renewal, physical renewal, and moral renewal. You are rejoicing on the highway that is leading you toward your eternal home.
- What were some of the words that we mentioned at the beginning of this study that are connected to spring and that remind us of that time of year?

In our spiritual formation, it is important that we look after our soul, we call it Soul Care.

There is one spiritual discipline that is very meaningful whatever season you find your soul in. It is called EXAMEN. It is a form of personal inventory. It is a time when you stop and reflect on your spiritual season.

REFLECTION

At this time take a few moments to reflect on your day.

- What have I done?
- Where have I gone?
- What has been my routine today?
- What disruptions have I encountered?
- What disappointments have I experienced?
- What discoveries have I made?

What conversations have I had?

In those areas ask yourself two questions:

When was I most alive, most joyful in the day?
 When was I most stressed, distracted today?

Another way of asking these questions could be:

When did I feel closest to God?
 When did I feel the farthest from God?

When you do this, maybe keep a journal where you can see your own spiritual portrait, your spiritual and emotional rhythm.

During this season we may experience a transformation into the image of Christ through a time of renewal. What a wonderful season it is!

Let's Talk About It:

Let your mind go back to your favourite summer vacation.

You could say it was your 'died and gone to heaven' type of summer vacation.

What made it so special?

Summer could be described as a foretaste of heaven, a rehearsal of paradise, a preview of the Promised Land.

Let's Dig Deeper

Read: Revelation 22:1-5 which could be describing the heart of summer

Revelation 22:2b –"…on each side of the river stood the tree of life, bearing 12 crops of fruit, yielding its fruit every month." Endless summer

Luke 21:29-31 – under the section, "Signs of the end of the Age"

Jesus definitely equates the kingdom of God with summer time. When you see leaves, blooming -you know summer is near.

2. What do we associate with summer?

Fruit, warmth, light, rest, play, reunions, holidays etc.

3. What is the connection that Jesus makes in this parable between summer and the kingdom?

There are lots of examples that Jesus gives about what the kingdom of the heaven is like, eg. It is a banquet, a joyful reunion, a festival, a homecoming...

In the soul season of summertime we experience all this, vitality, connectedness, rest. fruitfulness, warmth, shade.

So how do you know if you are experiencing the 'SUMMERTIME 'of your soul -if you are in that season?

Things just seem to flow, **joy rises from your soul naturally**, light **shines e**verywhere, and you have **energy to spare**. Most seasons will want something from us, some labour, some sacrifice, but summer-time just wants to give and give.

We just want to nourish ourselves, refresh ourselves, we just drink it all in.

Some of you may be thinking, I have more summers behind me than in front of me. That is just reality. When the question was asked previously, 'your favourite summer memory,' you took a moment to look back.

We get very nostalgic. Nostalgia is an inescapable part of summer.

Do you think that nostalgia could ever be an enemy of the summer of your soul?

5. Give some examples of how looking back could be an enemy in the church.

Mark Buchanan in his book, "*Spiritual Rhythm*", mentions that it can be an enemy for example of seeing the **church grow**. Why can't we do it the way we did back in the good old days, the golden days!!!

Not only in the church do we battle looking back, but we face our own nostalgia...

- I lost things I can't recover as a young officer I looked back for a while on the things I once had and 'lost'.
- We think of the former days when we might have experienced better health or

more energy.

Turn to Ezra 3:10-12

This is during the rebuilding of the temple in Jerusalem, surely a spiritual summertime for Israel. The foundation for the new temple is laid and they are ready to have a worship service to celebrate this occasion.

6. What do you notice happening in this passage?

7. What are the reactions to the building?

Some are praising the Lord for this wonderful event, and others are thinking about their loss and back to the old temple, they were remembering when....v12. Both sounds were heard afar off, some were sounds of weeping and others were sounds of joy.

"If any of them, old and young alike, knew what they really wanted—that they were 'looking forward to the city with foundations whose architect and builder is God' – then this current temple would have been nowhere near what they hoped and so much better than they remembered. *Anticipation would have replaced nostalgia.*"

Lets look at 3 Rhythms of Kingdom Living - modeled on summer living

Kingdom Living is not HURRIED - Stillness

"Endless busyness is earwax against God's voice and a blindfold to God's presence." Mark Buchanan, Spiritual Rhythm pg 125

What could you do in the summer to slow down and think about God's goodness?

Summer is typically active and restful together. We have a posture of ease and gratitude.

These are described as the lazy hazy crazy days of summer...try new adventures, take a different walk When it is summer time in your soul, it is time to try new spiritual practices, new ways to pray, praying the Scripture in a new way.

Kingdom Living is not WORRIED- Joy

As women, we seem to have this characteristic... it seems to come easy to us. Whether we worry about the future, worry about our health, worry about our children, grandchildren etc. The list goes on.

Is there something that you are worried about and you find your joy is

slipping away?

In the summer time of our soul we walk in the light, we bask in the light and warmth of God's presence. Joy is our birthright, Joy is the sign that the Lord's presence is with us. Joy is the anticipation of heaven, the joy of what is to come.

Kingdom Living Abounds in FRUIT - Abundance

Kingdom life, like summer living, abounds in fruit. We bask in the sheer abundance of God's provision.

If you have ever planted a garden, the crop is usually more than the average household can use. We have been the recipient of rhubarb tomatoes, squash etc because the crop was more than our neighbour could eat and use.

In the summertime of our soul, we realize that God does exceedingly abundantly more than we can ask or imagine, **Eph 3.20**.

When we are in the summertime of our soul, we seem to have insights into Bible passages, more than we did previously; we live in a state of discovery. It is an exciting time.

Beware of Dehydration

One of the hazards of summertime is drought.

Eg. Plants need lots of water in the summer. You can water the plants in the morning and by afternoon they can be wilting and needed more hydration. Living things parch quickly in the heat.

We need to soak things down.

In our spiritual summertime of the soul we need a continuous outpouring of the Holy Spirit and a deep saturation of the Word. Remember in the parable of the seed and sower? When the sun came the plants were scorched. Sure we have talked about resting and playing in the summer, but one thing we cannot neglect is water, the Spiritual Disciplines of prayer and the Word.

Don't Mistake Leafiness for Fruitfulness

The story is told of a man who built a grape arbor and bought two tiny grape plants. He asked for the plant that would give him and his family the enjoyment of eating sweet grapes. The plants were tenderly planted and every year the branches got thicker and twined around the lattice of the arbor. Every year the crop produced dense clusters of grapes. The grower was excited to try the fruit from his two plants. But he was disappointed, they were plump, a dark purple in colour. He plucked one and put it in his mouth, it was like sucking lemons. It was hard and bitter. "*What was I doing wrong*?" he asked himself.

So he went to someone who had a green thumb. He discovered that he was not cutting back the leaves to let the sun shine on the grapes. But he liked those leaves; they provided shade in the hot sun. What he learned was that he was nurturing a mass of green leaves at the cost of a good crop.

He could either have much shade and little fruit, or he could have much fruit and **little** shade. He couldn't have both.

Back to the passage we began with from Luke 21:29-31. Jesus cursed a fig tree that had great leaves but the fruit was absent. The fruitfulness is what is important, leaves mean nothing. It is by our fruit that we are known.

What about us, we look at all those green leaves of busyness and think wow, look at the fruit being produced!! But busyness is not always fruitful.

We talked at the beginning of summer being like the coming of the kingdom, something to look forward to, anticipation rather than looking back. What are we anticipating?

Luke 21 describes the signs of the kingdom what will happen when the end is near.

Let's Take Time To Reflect

Just as there are signs of the time when the Kingdom is drawing near, things that are unpleasant to experience, things mentioned in Luke 21, But what a wonderful day it will be when we see Christ. It will be summertime of our soul all year long. But for now we will experience those summer thunderstorms even in the warm season of summer. Don't be surprised, it is only for a short time as we anticipate the Lord's return.

What would it mean for you to experience the season of summer in your soul?

Do you spend a great deal of time looking back or do you look forward to the Promised Land?

During the season of summer we are **transformed in His image** by taking unhurried time to spend with the Lord and He will transform our worries and our lives will be fruitful for Him.

Women's Bible Study #4 – The Season of Fall

There is something exciting about the change of seasons. My favourite season is fall, although I enjoy the change in all the seasons.

As previously mentioned, I am basing this study on a book by a Canadian Christian author, Mark Buchanan, entitled, *Spiritual Rhythm.* Mark Buchanan stated that life is more about rhythm than balance. Our world is made up of rhythm. We get up, eat, work, play, eat, sleep, that is the rhythm of life. There is a rhythm to life and death, work and rest, night and day.

Today we will discover together something that will assist us when we are in the fall season of our lives. We want to discover something that will help us recognize the spiritual season that we are experiencing. I remind you that this has nothing to do with our chronological age. However, it does have to do with what we are experiencing at this moment in our spiritual lives. The person sitting beside you may be in a different season than you. So often we don't know what others are going through.

Discussion:

1. What are some characteristics of the fall season?

You may have mentioned the colours of fall. If you have lived in various locations in Canada, you will be aware that fall colours differ depending on the region you are talking about. The colours in the Maritimes and the Musoka regions of northern Ontario are breathtaking. (other regions may also be named...Ottawa Valley, Quebec etc.)

In this study we will mainly be focusing on the season of FALL and discover how it relates to our spiritual formation.

The Core of FALL – Harvest Time

At the very centre of Fall is HARVEST TIME. Through scripture we read about the harvest time and it was a time of thanksgiving – thankful for God's faithfulness.

In the previous seasons of our soul, we discovered that there is **renewal in the spring**, seeds are planted, we see the blooms appear. In the **summer we take time in the stillness to reflect on past experiences**. Winter winds blow and it may seem dark around us. God may seem absent, friends may seem far away.

Your response to the other seasons in your life, will dictate how fruitful the harvest will be as we experience the fall season of our soul.

2. What kind of seeds have we sown? Everyone sows some kind of seed.

You may remember Chuck Colson who ended up in prison after a lifetime of sowing to the flesh. Amazing event happened to him while he was in prison. In the winter time of his life, he found the Lord. He no longer wanted to sow to the sinful nature and began sharing with others the joy that he found.

Each season has a dominant mood:

Winter = mournful

Spring = joy brings hope

Summer = joy brings satisfaction

Fall = the joy that brings fulfillment

So if we want the joy of fulfillment we must sow abundantly.

We must sow something. Think for a moment of the parable of the talents. It emphasizes more on money than agriculture, but the principle is still the same. We need to plant something.

Digging Deeper – Three Harvests

Harvest of Souls

Read: John 4:35-36

Matthew 9:35-38

What do these verses suggest about the harvest of souls?

All we have to do is look around and we will see those who are ripe for hearing the Gospel. The trouble is there are more people ready to come into a loving saving transforming relationship with God than we have people ready to share.

Can you relate an opportunity that you had to plant a seed of 'good news' to someone?

Maybe you have been able to see the harvest after planting the seed. Maybe you were able to reap the harvest of someone else who had scattered the seed. You may have prayed a long time for a family member, a neighbour, a member of your church. Then one day you reap the soul harvest.

Read: Galatians 6:9

How does Galatians 6:9 encourage you in the area of soul harvest?

Look around, pray and then go. Watch what God will do when you are a willing labourer.

<u>Harvest of Prosperity</u>

Read: 2 Corinthians 9:6-12

- 6. Do you recall one lesson about money that you learned from your parents?
- 7. How does generosity affect righteousness in your life?

What has been the harvest for you when you have been generous to others?

This is not a verse to encourage health and wealth gospel where God is filling your bank account, where you are adorned with diamonds as you drive down the street in your Porsche! He is simply saying generosity is good for the soul.

"True prosperity is not measured by how much anyone has: it's measured by how much you give."

Mark Buchanan - Spiritual Rhythm, pg. 165

Do you agree with the above quote? Discuss

C. <u>A Harvest of Righteousness</u>

Read: Hebrews 12:11

10. Take a moment to think about the most difficult situation you are facing at this moment?

11. Can you see how you are being transformed in His image during this time in your life?

What two things are involved in this harvest of righteousness from this verse?

This harvest requires two things:

- \Rightarrow Submit to God's discipline
- \Rightarrow Seek God's peace

There are painful times we may be going through that we wish we did not have to endure.

Sometimes we would rather just run away from them. However, later on these painful times of discipline will produce a harvest; something wonderful will come as a result of the Lord's discipline.

Read: James 3:18

Do you need to seek peace and sow peace somewhere, in your home, your workplace, your church?

The result will be a harvest of righteousness.

Fall is a season for reaping, (the harvest of our labours), and for storing, gathering the harvest for our needs in another season.

Fall is also for feasting and thanking.

For a spiritual healthy rhythm in the fall season of our lives, it is important that we have times of feasting and times of thanking. We know about feasting during Thanksgiving. We usually see so much wonderful produce in the stores during the fall season.

You could say that autumn feasts are festivals of thanks.

Can you imagine coming to a thanksgiving feast and not being thankful to the host who prepared the wonderful feast and not saying a word of thanks?

Not likely, you would want to express gratitude for the food, to those who had taken the time to prepare the feast. Unspoken praise is not praise at all. We need to speak our thanksgiving.

Spiritual feasting allows us the opportunity to prepare for the winter season of our souls. These are times when we feast on what we have stored up. We want to be well fed on the Word of God that will get us through the difficult dark days of the winter season of our soul.

Concluding Review:

Whatever season you are in, it is important to identify that season and realize that you are being 'transformed into His image.'

You may recognize that you are in the season of **Fall**; harvesting the seeds that have been sown over the years. Be ready, the season of **Winter** may be just around the corner when you will experience dark days when God seems far away. Maybe you are in the season of **Spring**; the season of hope when you are experiencing renewal and new birth, an awakening in your spiritual life. Or could it be that you are in the spiritual season of **Summer** when it is satisfying to see growth?

Time to Reflect:

Whatever season you are in, it is important to identify it. In our own spiritual formation, there are always changes.

- Can you think of the changes that you have gone through over the past year in your own life?
- Have there been any surprises as you have done this study on the spiritual seasons?
- Have you been aware of the areas of your life that need transformation?

<u>Prayer</u>

Conclude this session by taking time to thank God for the seasons you have experienced. Ask him to **transform you into His image** by the various experiences of those seasons.

Do I reflect God in my life?

I love this picture of my grandchildren.

It's a pretty cool picture. As I looked at the picture and saw how it beautifully reflected my grandchildren jumping and playing in the water, it got me thinking, do I reflect God in my life?

John 13:35 says "This is how everyone will recognize that you are my disciples – when they see the love you have for each other."

This is challenging. When others see me, do they see Jesus? I know that I am flawed and can be selfish at times so how can I reflect God?

First of all, I am thankful that reflecting God isn't something I do on my own. It isn't something I conjure up or put on. I reflect God because the Holy Spirit lives in me.

Galatians 2:20 describes this so well when it says: "It is no longer I who live, but it is Christ who lives in me. This life that I live now, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave his life for me.

I reflect God in my life only when I follow the leading of the Holy Spirit. Scripture tells us that when we give our lives to God we are a new creation and because we are God's followers, filled by His Spirit, we can reflect God.

Ephesians 4:24 says, "You must put on the new self, which is created in God's likeness and reveals itself in the true life that is upright and holy."

The next question is, what does it look like to reflect God? In Galatians, Paul gives us a great description of what our life should look like if we are reflecting God.

Galatians 5:22-23 "But the Spirit produces love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, ²³ humility, and self-control."

The fruit of the spirit are God's list of His qualities. These are qualities that should be in our lives if we want to reflect God.

Love, joy, peace, patience and self-control are all qualities that are to be part of our lives. These qualities reflect God. Kindness, goodness and gentleness are qualities that we show to others. These qualities must be seen in our lives if we are to reflect God.

<u>Kindness</u>

The dictionary describes kindness as "a kind deed, friendly regard shown to another"

Jesus showed compassion over and over again in Scripture. There are countless accounts of Jesus healing the sick and performing miracles, all from a heart of compassion. Matthew 12 records a time when Jesus showed his kind heart to a stranger on the street. The man's withered hand caught Jesus' attention and caused him to stop in his tracks. Even in the face of ridicule, Jesus healed the man on the Sabbath.

Do I show kindness to others? What about when it isn't convenient or it costs me something. Do I still reflect God by showing kindness?



Goodness

We all want to be known as good people. But what does that mean in everyday life? The place to look for examples of "good" is, of course, to Jesus.

Jesus washing the feet of His disciples at the Last Supper is a perfect example of goodness. His mercy towards His followers is shown in the way that he lowered Himself to serve others.

I must ask myself do I seek to serve others. Do I put the needs of others ahead of myself?

Gentleness

In John 8, Jesus saves the life of a woman caught in adultery. He rebukes the crowd and reaches out His hand to show forgiveness. Jesus shows such gentleness and love to this woman who was cast out and judged by society.

Do I show kindness to others or do I judge them?

Just as the picture of my grandchildren is a reflection of them playing, so my life should be a reflection of God.

Paul Gilbert wrote a poem:

You are writing a Gospel, A chapter each day, By deeds that you do, By words that you say.

Men read what you write, Whether faithless or true; Say, what is the Gospel According to you?"

Am I showing Kindness, goodness and gentleness? Do I reflect God?

"THE STORY TABLE"

Source unknown

Invite a small group to share a meal. Keep the amount to those who can comfortable sit around the table. Setting is important (Should be quiet enough to hear one another...and God's voice). *Definitely doesn't have to be fancy. You are creating a place for sharing and relationship to grow.

A modest meal is served. Soup, sandwiches, BBQ...you decide what works best in your location. You eat, and "chatter"...these are ordinary moments...but what happens next is extraordinary. Each person (in their invitation) is instructed to share a story of

1) a life lesson God is teaching them

- 2) a personal burden or concern
- 3) a passion that they have for others or a particular ministry group.

They have 5 minutes or less... (Less is fine, but no one can go over their 5 minutes).

Close with prayer that encompasses the needs and encourages those at the table. "The Story Table" can be repeated several times.

MANNA CAFÉ

We offer a home cooked meal ranging from soup and sandwiches to a fully cooked turkey dinner with all the trimmings at no cost. The Town of Gananoque provided a grant of 13,000 to update the kitchen and café with new appliances and a complete make over. The café is opened to all from 1130 to 2:00 p.m. Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays. Guests of the café come from all types of life situations. This is a place where people can meet friends, share a meal and good conversation and always feel welcome.



WALK AEROBICS

We began a walking program in Port Aux Basques 11 years. It quickly went from 3 mornings a week (at 10:00 a.m.), to 5 mornings a week, to 8 classes a week (5 morning plus 3 evening classes). It really went over well there. Since then, 7 or 8 other churches in that area have begun the same program with much success. There are Corps however, that have tried it and it did not work. I think publicity and advertising is the key! Word of mouth is always the best!

Don't get discouraged if it does not take off with a bang, I was told it would not work in PAB and we only and we only had a handful for the first couple of months (from 4 to 7 or 8), but we persisted and were excited about it, and it finally paid off! I also started it in St Catharines corps (Monday, Wednesday and Friday mornings at 10 am) after we were there about a year and it is still going over very well there, with over 30 in each class! And now have it running in Sydney, for almost 2 years.

We use "Leslie Sansone's Walk Away the Pounds" videos. I begin each class with a short devotion from "Devotions for Dieters" then put the video on and we just work along with it. She has many videos that are all easy to follow. I suggest 2 mile or 30 minute workouts. I advertised in the Newspaper, on the Local Cable Station, in church bulletins (other denominations), to Women's' groups, put posters on bulletin boards around town (Apartment buildings, stores, doctors/dentist offices...) anything that works but be sure to GET THE WORD OUT THERE! This is much of the key to your success!

If you are going to purchase the DVD's, my suggestion would be to get the Leslie Sansone's -Walk the Walk (A Christian Inspired Workout that includes a 1 and a 2 mile walk, with Christian music playing in the background); A Closer Walk (also Christian); Walking Down your Blood Sugar; A Heart-Healthy Walk... to name a few. You can order them online and also occasionally get some at Walmart, Giant tiger, Shoppers Drug Mart...

Each video begins with a warm up, then some upbeat walking, and ends with a cool down. These videos are easy to follow and should not intimidate anyone. (We had people in their 70's & 80's, and some very overweight ladies who enjoyed it). We usually stay with the 2 miles or 30 minute walks.

I try to stress the importance of caring for our bodies in a safe and supportive environment. (After all it is God's Temple and it's the only one we're going to get this side of heaven.... so we must care for it properly).

We do not charge for this program, but because we attract so many community people, they often want to contribute something. So, we place a container near the doorway, where they could drop in some change, if they so desired. (We have raised thousands this way). By not charging, you leave it open to those who cannot afford weight Watchers and gyms, and that is really what we ought to be about, ministering to the whole community.

Also, these people also are a great help to our Corps in collecting for Red Shield, Kettle Volunteers, serving at Corps dinners/ function, etc., not to mention building lasting relationships with those outside our church.
