Sing and Make Music

Adapted from a program by Bev McMurray Australia Eastern Territory



Preparation:

- A display of musical instruments could be set up: piano keyboard, brass instruments, guitar, banjo, kit drums or any percussion instruments, piano accordion.
- A banner made with some music symbols: treble clef, bass clef, music notes

Equipment: Cassette/stereo player, if no pianist

Guest: Invite someone who could present some items of musical contribution to the meeting: if not from the corps, perhaps from your community: pianist, singer, choir (school or seniors), instrumentalist, or guitarist.

Game Suggestions:

- **1. Pass the parcel**: With each layer of paper unwrapped, a song is revealed which the ladies sing together
- **2. Name that song**: Pianist to play a tune and stop; someone identify the song. If a pianist is not available, a tape could be made of snippets of songs which could be played and stopped
- **3. Karaoke**: For the fun loving group: a Karaoke DVD could be acquired to see who are the 'out going' ones!
- **4. Celebrity Heads**: Headbands are placed on three or four players, with names of music stars. They do not know who they represent. The players take turns to ask one question at a time about who they are (e.g. Am I a male? Do I sing? Am I a rock star? Am I a ballad singer? Do I play violin?). If they get the answer right, they can ask a second question. If they get the answer wrong, the next player has a turn. The first player to guess who they are is the winner.

Devotions:

Music is a wonderful thing. It is a way of expressing feelings. For example, love songs; couples can even have 'their' song – one that meant something to them when they got engaged or married.
