The story of Susan Boyle - 'I Dreamed a Dream'.

The surprising discovery of Susan Boyle's powerful and moving voice immediately broke through the record books.

Some facts

Susan Boyle's first album, I Dreamed a Dream, was released on 23 November 2009 and became Amazon's best-selling album in pre-sales.

In only six weeks of sales, it became the biggest selling album in the world for 2009, selling 9 million copies.

In September 2010, Boyle was officially recognised by Guinness World Records as having had the fastest-selling debut album by a female artist in the UK, the most successful first week's sales of a debut album in the UK, and was also awarded the record for being the oldest person to reach number one with a debut album in the UK.¹

The start of the dream

In some ways, Susan Boyle's story is just the same as any woman with a voice in any choir up and down the UK. In her home town of Blackburn, she had been schooled in singing in churches and choral societies. She says now that, as a shy young woman with some learning difficulties, being hidden under the blanket of a collective singing arrangement offered her comfort.

So in one other, crucial way, her story is entirely her own. The most unlikely chorister in the sea of voices stepped out of line and put her head above the parapet to be noticed. For Susan Boyle, though she would never deign to say so much herself, this was an act of personal heroism, the like of which she had never contemplated before.²

Scripture Reflection

There are so many examples all through Scripture of how God spoke to his people through dreams.

Sometimes he spoke directly to the individual, as Pharaoh was fore-warned of the famine in his dream (Genesis 41) although he needed Joseph to interpret it to him.

Or the time when God spoke directly to Jacob in his dream after he had killed his brother and was running away. God affirmed his relationship with Jacob by referring to the promise that he had made with his fore-fathers and by assuring Jacob that hHe wanted the same close relationship with him. Jacob may have run away from God, but God still had plans for his life.

God often gave the message for his people to a prophet in a dream in order that the prophet would deliver it with God's authority.

Numbers 12:6 (NIV UK)

'He said, "Listen to my words: "When a prophet of the Lord is among you, I reveal myself to him in visions, I speak to him in dreams."

A Modern-Day True Story

God's plan delivered in a dream

This is a true story of a young 17-year-old lad who was struggling to find direction for his career and his future. He was part of a loving Christian family and his own character was that of a gentle, loving boy who respected his parents and participated in church life with his family. He had a personal spirituality that helped him believe that God had a plan for his future – he just could not see it, nor did he have any hint what it might be.

He enjoyed music and participated in musical activities in his church and took private lessons to increase his own skills because somehow he felt it would be an important part of his life. However, in general terms he would have been described as 'average' both in academic achievement and in musical skills and abilities. In fact he often struggled with self-confidence and belief in his own abilities.

One night as he went to bed with all his concerns on his mind, he asked God for guidance with regard to his future in planning and choosing a career. As he lay there he asked himself the questions, 'What am I good at?' His own reply to himself was – 'Nothing'. Then he asked the question, 'What can I do?' His answer was – 'Play an instrument' (two, in fact). That night as he slept he had a dream and saw himself marching up the Mall in London playing in the a Guards Band.

He told his parents of his dream. His father was very sceptical and discouraged any further development of his enquiry, realising that his son was a timid and very gentle lad. His mother, recognising that her son was actually facing a huge challenge, nonetheless encouraged him and assisted him in realising his dream. Although the result meant a great deal of personal pain both for the parents and for the young man, the young man subsequently successfully completed his training and found himself a Musician in one of the Guards Bands of the Royal Household Troops taking part in all the important ceremonial and official appointments in London and around the world. He had truly followed his dream. In so doing, he became a very positive influence within the band and found himself a mentor to many young men who followed the same profession and struggled with the sometimes difficult environment of military life.

It was by a dream that God revealed to Mary his plan for the world and the vital role that she would play in that mission. The result depended on her obedience in following that vision in spite of the difficulties that she would encounter within her family and the culture of her faith.

Similarly Joseph was reassured in a dream of the importance of his role in God's plan and the necessity of his continued involvement in Mary's life in order that Jesus could fulfil the prophecies of his birth and lineage.

For our part, we should encourage our young people to 'dream big dreams' and to explore God's plan for them in how they envision their future.

But God still has plans for the older generation too. Our dreams may not concern our career, but they do point to our future. Our spiritual life is not confined to the limitations of our physical life. We have a bright and secure future in the life eternal that God has at the heart of his plan for all his children.

Allow your own heart to dream. See yourself in your celestial home where there will be no more suffering and no more tears and seek in your own heart to know more and more the Saviour who will lead you there.

For Susan Boyle, the fearlessness to dream about something other than the lot that life had handed her was the chance to escape – like the Old Testament stories of the Hebrew people who needed to find the new life that God had promised to them.

She and others like the young lad have had the courage to dream and then act on their dreams. So can you, and perhaps you will discover that God can take you to a whole new experience of hHimself that you had never realiszed possible.
