Plan a festive & joy filled evening with your ladies as you prepare your hearts for the Christmas season. As Christmas approaches, let's pause to celebrate the joy and light that Jesus brings.

Arrival

As ladies arrive have Christmas music quietly playing in the background. If you know someone who can play a musical instrument (piano, violin) this would add a special touch to your evening.

You could prepare a Christmas table talk activity for each table. Christmas Table talk cards are a perfect way to build relationships and make connections as the ladies share stories and reminisce around their table. Set up a Christmas drink station so that ladies can enjoy a hot/cold beverage as they arrive. You could ask someone from a local café or someone from your corps/community that specializes in making festive drinks to assist with this. Pinterest.com has some great ideas for decorating and drink suggestions.









Use a photo booth with sparkle props for ladies to take pictures together to capture the memory of the evening. You can purchase background drops and photo props on amazon.ca. at an affordable price. You can also set up a photo background using your own Christmas decorations with a Christmas tree and other props.







Icebreaker: Merry or Not? A fun "this or that" Christmas version

This game can be played as a group or around the table. It's a fun way to break the ice or serve as a quick fun game to start your night. Read each pair of options aloud. Ladies choose which they prefer by raising a paper plate with "This" on one side and "That" on the other. You could also use a thumbs up for "This" and thumbs down for "That."

Here are some Questions: Hot chocolate or Apple Cider, Real tree or Fake tree, Silent Night or Jingle bells, Sugar cookies or Gingerbread cookies, Turkey or Ham, Christmas sweater or Christmas pajamas, Wrapping paper or Gift bag, Elf or Home Alone, Cozy Christmas P.Js or a Sparkly Christmas Dress...

Décor Ideas

Theme colors – soft gold, twinkle white, cranberry red, forest green. Include fairy lights or LED candles or lanterns to create a cozy atmosphere.

Tables can be beautifully decorated with white, red, or green table clothes, burlap runners with pinecones, mini lights, sprigs of greenery and holly berries. Pinterest.com has some beautiful table decorating and centerpiece ideas.











Table Favor ideas – Wrapped Christmas Sugar cookies, Holiday Potpourri, Homemade Christmas Candle, etc.








Taste Testing/Giveaways





Christmas Demonstration Ideas

Testimony - Shining God's Light

Invite a lady to share her testimony. Here are somef ideas that you can use for sharing.

- 1. Light Through a trial Have someone share how they clung to faith and kept hope alive during a difficult time in their lives, showing that even in the pain, God's light can shine powerfully through resilience and faith.
- 2. From hiding to shining A testimony of breaking free from fear, shame, or people pleasing and learning to boldly let God's light be seen in your life.
- 3. Carrying light to others Have someone share how God opened doors to encourage, mentor, disciple other women, becoming an agent of His light in the darkness.

Light it up!


For the beginning of the devotional time, dim the lights. As music plays in the background pass a lit lantern to one another to symbolize being light in darkness. Encourage the women to think about the significance of passing the light. (This may work best if the ladies are sitting in a circle.)

As a child, one of our family traditions on Christmas Eve was to drive around our town to see the Christmas lights and displays. My childhood memories are filled with brightly lit ice trees (the Labrador winters were always a bonus at Christmas), snow sculptures and houses with everything from Rudolph 'with his nose so bright' to beautiful Nativity scenes. It was magical... and the kid in me still thinks it is! The lights of Christmas evoke feelings of joy, expectation and calm, but those feelings seem deeper than they once did; maybe because my childish views have changed to understand the truth of a promise given so many years ago. A promise which now is a reality, "The true light that gives light to everyone was coming into the world." (John: 9.)

In Scripture the metaphor of light and darkness is a familiar one. The biblical writers used it to create a clear distinction between what is evil, deceptive, and ungodly versus what is good, wholesome and holy. John, the gospel writer reminds us, when Jesus came he was the true light.

This promise from John's Gospel reminds us Jesus came to dispel and scatter the darkness. In a world that offers enlightenment in many forms John calls Jesus the authentic light. He came as a Divine Revealer. John refers to him as 'true light', meaning he is the real- the ultimate light who is for everyone. We know all the darkness that exists around us cannot overcome or extinguish the light He brings. Jesus said, "I am the Light of the World." (John 8:12). His purpose was to lead us away from spiritual darkness into his glorious truth.

Once we encounter His light, something miraculous happens- we carry His light within us. Jesus told his disciples "Your lives light up the world..." (Matthew 5:14-16 TPT).



We are reflections of His light. Jesus is the source of light that brings understanding to our hearts and illuminates our spiritual path which leads to transformation. "We were once darkness but now we are children of light." (Ephesians 5:8) We are called to walk in that light as people who reflect the character of Jesus. Matthew 5:14–15 reminds us our light is not meant to be hidden. We are called to shine!

"Jesus the Light of the World, has placed us in a particular time and place in history, in the lives of specific people, within a specific place to shine brightly for Him, holding forth the Word of Life in a million different little ways. We carry his light within us, and those who see it cannot help but be attracted to the Light. The True Light desires to give light to everyone: and what's more amazing, He wants to use us, His people, to spread the Light." (Asheritah Ciuciu- Unwrapping the Names of Jesus As you find yourself drinking in the wonder of the Christmas scenes around you this year, as the dazzling lights catch your attention and you enjoy the light displays, remember the True Light that gives light to everyone... has come into the World! Let's celebrate!

Prayer:

Jesus Light of the World, fill me with your light. Make my living a reflection of who you are. Teach me not to fear the darkness for you have overcome it- Your life's blood has dispelled its threat and I rest comfortably in the light of your love. Let my soul be so full of You, that wherever you place me the reflection of your light dispels the dark places of this world. Use me that you might be glorified.

Conclusion: (You may choose to have a vocal or sing a song as a group) Have a string of Christmas lights available with the bulbs removed. Invite the ladies to come and put a bulb in the string of lights as a reminder we all can be light in a dark world. When we are connected to Christ, we can make a difference individually and corporately.
