## **Devotional:** Life's Bouquet

Who amongst us has lived without worry or stress? To be alive is to have those experiences in life. Yet, in the midst of whatever life brings our way, we can find a place of calmness, peace and rest when we actively pursue it. Being in an outdoor setting often provides the avenue to de-stress. Sometimes, but not always, socializing can provide an avenue to destress. At other times, having fun and laughter can provide an avenue to de-stress. It is my hope that our time together today has provided an opportunity for you to step outside your everyday routine and to provide the relaxation that will enhance your well-being.

In Luke 12, in speaking to the disciples, Jesus gives us some key elements to remember when faced with stressful and worrisome experiences:





- V. 22 "*Do not worry*" This is easier said than done; yet Jesus wouldn't have said it if it were not possible to accomplish.
- V. 23 "Life is much more important" Jesus said that is it more important than food or clothes— two very important things, especially in the Western hemisphere, where both are found in abundance and where everyone often eats to excess and has more clothes than one can wear out.
- V. 24 "*God feeds them!*" These words seem to come in response to the unuttered question, "If we are not to worry about either of these things, especially the food which we need for survival, then who will provide for us?"
- V. 25 "*Can any of you live a bit longer by worrying about it?*" Jesus asked a thought provoking, yet practical question for his listeners to ponder. Yet, it's really a rhetorical question, for there is only one answer "No". As a matter of fact, health experts will tell us that worry will do the opposite—it will shorten our life.
- V. 28 "*It is God who clothes the wild grass*" Jesus recognizes and respondsas the disciples' asked question about the provision of clothing as well as food. He reassures them that God is the provider of all things and will provide for them just as he provides for the natural world.
- V. 28 "*How little faith you have*" Jesus reminds them that to be concerned about these things is really an extension of our question about God's ability to provide for us.
- V. 29 "So don't be all upset" Don't stress yourselves out, even though these things are important to you.
- V. 30 "*Your Father knows that you need these things.*" God is aware of what you need to survive and thrive in this world.
- V. 31 "*Be concerned with his Kingdom, and He will provide you with these things*" In other words, "Get your priorities right. Kingdom business comes first; when this is your primary concern, God will ensure that the necessities are provided for you."

So, when we set God first in our life, and when we move toward accomplishing his will, life's bouquet of joys and sorrows, its struggles and worries, are tempered by the assurance that God knows what we need. Let us trust in Him to provide for us.
