Introduction to Program:

Tonight it's all about Traffic.

We use the roads every day. Whether we drive, take a bus, taxi, or walk we are guided by the roads, and we use the signs to let us know where we are and what to do next. I'm sure we all appreciate the detour sign that tells us to take another route well before we get stuck at a dead end. If that sign wasn't there, there would be some pretty unhappy drivers.

Not everyone is a driver, but it's important that we all follow the rules of the road. Some people say that the pedestrian always has the right of way. But not so, if we are hit by a car from running across the street, where there is no cross walk, then the driver may not be at fault. So we need to pay attention to the signs.

A lot of stuff happens on our streets today. What do you see every day around our streets? Name some things- good or bad...allow time for sharing.

(Prostitutes hang out on street corners, drugs are sold right on the streets, friends walk on the streets, kids play hockey on the streets, drivers speeding on the streets, bikers, runners, dogs, cats, horses...)

Tonight, we're going to have a little fun with Traffic, so fasten your seatbelts, cause you are in for a great ride!
